TASK ORGANIZATION: MCB ONE THIRTY-THREE (Herein known as the Battalion)

1. SITUATION. In accordance with references (a) and (b), the Battalion is undergoing a training and organizational period. As part of this training, the Battalion will deploy a Provisional Rifle/Weapons Company of approximately 100 men to Camp Lejeune, North Carolina under the following conditions:

a. Enemy forces. None

b. Friendly forces.

c. Detachment. Approximately 100 man Provisional Rifle/Weapons Company to MCB SIXTY-TWO.

2. MISSION. Pursuant to references (a) and (b), the Battalion is to deploy a Provisional Rifle/Weapons Company of approximately 100 men to CAMLEJ in conjunction with general military training and the use of crew-served weapons.

3. EXECUTION: When directed by the Commanding Officer of MCB SIXTY-TWO about 30 September 1966 the Provisional Rifle/Weapons Company will depart CBC, Gulfport and deploy to Camp Lejeune for approximately four weeks. While in training and during transit, the company will maintain the same readiness condition as MCB ONE THIRTY-THREE.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS:

a. Standard operational procedures, set forth by reference (c) will be followed.

b. Leave shall be administered in accordance with reference (d).

c. The company will utilize Annexes A, B and C of reference (e) while it is under MCB SIXTY-TWO OPCON.



5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL:

a. The Commanding Officer, MCB ONE THIRTY-THREE will direct the Officer-in-Charge, MCB ONE THIRTY THREE Provisional Rifle/Weapons Company to report to the Commanding Officer, MCB SIXTY-TWO for OPCON on or about 29 September 1966 but not later than MCB SIXTY-TWO's departure from Gulfport.

b. The Battalion is authorized direct liaison with MCB SIXTY-TWO, CAMLEJ, and component activities.
