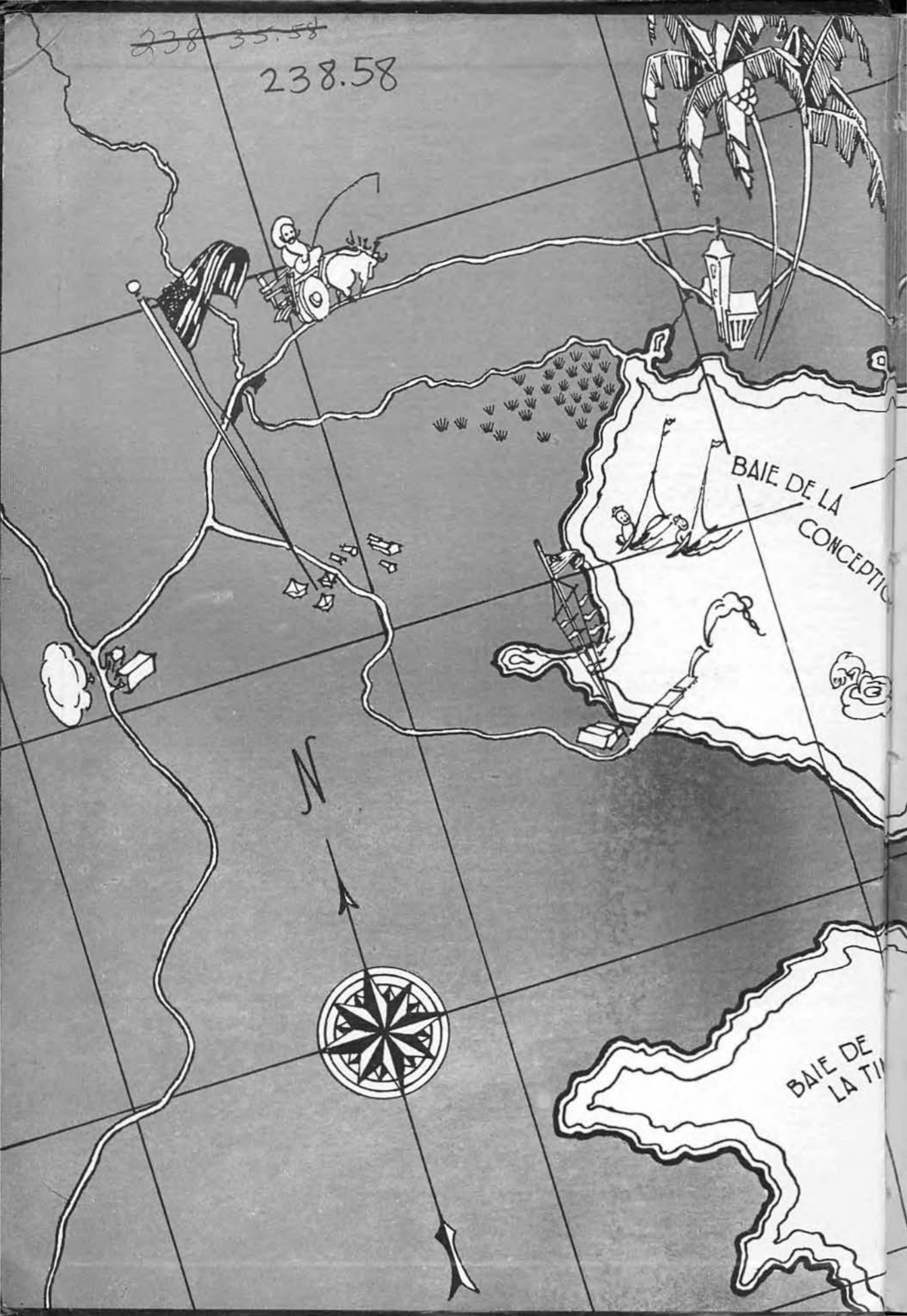

AN HISTORICAL STATEMENT

Construction Battalion Maintenance Unit No. 536 was commissioned on September 23rd 1943 in Gulfport, Mississippi, a standard organization of five officers and two hundred sixty-nine enlisted men. However, before that commissioning took place, much had been accomplished towards making civilians into Seabees and the men had seen several phases of Navy life.

From all over the United States, construction men had come to Williamsburg, Virginia, during that spring of 1943 to receive what Navy men refer to as "boot training." Among these were the men who were to form the foundation of this Unit. "Boot Training" consisted of six weeks of military training in which "close order" and "extended order" drill played the major roles. When it was over the "Boots" were granted a sixty-two hour liberty.

On their return they found themselves assigned to the 103rd U. S. Naval Construction Battalion and it was with this Battalion that they proceeded to Camp Endicott, Davisville, Rhode Island, in July of 1943.

In Davisville, the time was short and the training more intense. Some of the men attended schools, where they were familiarized with standard Navy equipment; others continued military training. Here, the entire Battalion spent a week on the rifle range and many became qualified marksmen. In August,

ten day embarkation leaves were granted to the major portion of the Battalion. On their return, the Battalion shoved off for Gulfport, Mississippi.

At Gulfport, the rest of the Battalion were given their leaves and the remainder were assigned to construction projects at the Camp. In September, the "scuttlebutt," that the Battalion would be broken up, became a reality by the decommissioning of the 103rd and the subsequent commissioning of four Maintenance Units of which this organization was one.

In December, the Unit embarked for an advanced naval base in the South Pacific area to accomplish the mission to which it had been assigned, the job of maintaining an Advanced Naval Base, that quick-moving Allied offensives had left far behind front lines.

The following story in pictures tells the tale of the Unit's everyday life on this South Pacific Island. It is not a "blood and thunder" story of Seabees being shot off bulldozers as they carve airfields out of enemy-ridden jungles, but a brief recording of the humdrum, routine life of a Seabee Maintenance man, doing a Job that is apparently endless, a Job that is colorless because it is not front page news, but a Job that is meritorious because of its importance in maintaining the road that leads to Tokyo.
