LEGO® Semaphore Flag Activity National Museum of the American Sailor Activity

Semaphore is a very important form of visual communication that is often used by sailors to communicate over long distances. The distance might be from one ship to another or even as

far from ship to shore. A sailor will hold a flag in each hand and have their arms placed in a specific, unique position to represent a number or letter in the alphabet. Imagine if the sailors didn't have these flags to communicate; that would lead to a lot of miscommunication!

Supplies

- LEGO[®] or other building blocks
- Pencil
- Notebook

Instructions

Using a flat base, use any LEGO[®] or similar



building blocks to create your own set of semaphore flags to communicate with your friends or family. Will you create flags for each letter of the alphabet and use them to spell out messages like the sailors in the U.S. Navy? Or perhaps you'll create one flag to represent a specific phrase?

Whichever option you choose, make sure you use a pencil and notebook to write down what each flag represents. You don't want to accidentally send the wrong message! Share your idea with your friends or family so you all can communicate together.
