1. Purpose. To publish specific details of subject ceremony.
2. General. Six months after the attack on the United States at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, the United States Navy inflicted irreparable damage to the Imperial Japanese Navy during the Battle of Midway. To commemorate this great American Naval victory, the Chief of Naval Operations, per reference (a), has directed all naval commands to conduct a wreath laying ceremony on 3 June 2011.
3. Specific Details. The following specific details apply for the ceremony:
 - a. Time/date of ceremony: 0900, 3 June 2011.
 - b. Place of ceremony: Ferry Landing.
 - c. Organization to furnish music: Public Affairs will provide music by CD.
 - d. Uniform:
 - (1) United States Navy:
 - (a) Official Party: Uniform of the Day (NWU).
 - (b) Flag Bearers: Uniform of the Day (NWU).

(2) Ushers: Uniform of the Day.

(3) Guests: Military: Uniform of the day.
Civilian: Daily work attire.

4. Responsibilities

a. Executive Officer. Overall coordinator for the ceremony. Assign additional tasking to departments as required.

b. Invocation/Benediction: Chaplain Douglas E. Holmes.

c. Command Master Chief

(1) Master of Ceremony.

(2) Provide Sailor to be wreath bearer.

(3) Coordinate with Naval Hospital for Ceremonial Guard.

(4) Provide ushers.

d. Morale, Welfare and Recreation. Provide the following items in accordance with enclosure (1):

(1) All general guest seating chairs.

(2) Two lecterns - One for the Executive Officer and one for the Master of Ceremonies (MC).

(3) A sound system (with technician).

e. Navy Exchange. Provide wreath for the ceremony.

f. Public Affairs

(1) Develop and produce ceremony program.

(2) Maintain ceremonial history and develop lessons learned for similar future events as directed by reference (a).

(3) Provide media coverage for publication in the Gazette and release to Navy.mil.

g. Security. Block off section of Ferry Landing parking area for the ceremony.

h. Air Operations. Provide C-12 for fly-by.

5. Rehearsal. A rehearsal of all participants will be conducted at 0900, 2 June 2011 at Ferry Landing. Uniform for rehearsal will be the working uniform.
