1. The following command history of USS ALEXANDRIA (SSN 757) is submitted in accordance with reference (a). As the ship was commissioned in 1991 and no previous history was submitted, the following history covers the period from initial manning in 1988 through 1991.

2. Command composition and organization.

Mission: To support the objectives of National defense policy in support of the U. S Atlantic Fleet by any possible means, including locating and destroying submarines and surface ships, conducting reconnaissance, strike warfare, mine planting, and operations with special warfare units.

Organizational structure: An element of Submarine Squadron TWO. Main operational departments are Engineering, Navigation/Operations, Combat Systems, and Supply.

Commanding Officer: Commander Paul E. Normand

Homeport: Groton CT

3. <u>Narrative</u>.

Named after the two cities of Alexandria, Virginia, and Alexandria, Louisiana, Pre-commissioning Unit ALEXANDRIA was initially manned in the summer of 1988, with her Commanding Officer, CDR Will Cooke. Following a slip in shipyard construction schedules CDR Cooke detached in Oct 89. In Dec 89 CDR Paul Normand reported as the Commanding Officer Pre-commissioning Unit ALEXANDRIA. She was christened USS ALEXANDRIA at her launching on 23 June 1990 by her sponsor, Myrtle "Tookie" Clark, wife of retired Vice Admiral Glenwood Clark, adopting the motto "Twice as Strong" in honor of her two namesake cities. Following launching in June of 1990, an aggressive testing and crew certification program resulted in the ship going in service in March of 1991. The ship next underwent a series of highly successful sea trials, culminating in her delivery to the Navy 37 days ahead of schedule.

Following commissioning of USS ALEXANDRIA on 29 June 1991, she commenced a series of shakedown cruises which included acoustic trials in the Bahamas, combat systems testing in the Virgin Islands, and port visits in Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico, and Fort Lauderdale, Florida. After successfully completing these tasks and extensive crew training she passed her initial operational propulsion system examination with flying colors. This was followed by also excelling in certification for tactical weapon employment including MK-48/ADCAP torpedoes, and HARPOON and TOMAHAWK cruise missiles.
