### PART C:

### NARRATIVE

1. USS PHILADELPHIA finished a regular overhaul in December of 1985. During the overhaul, the following major modifications were made:

CCS Mark I fire control system was installed.

BQQ-5C sonar suite was installed, replacing the BQQ-5B.

Towed array retrieval system was installed for the TB-16 towed array

ESGN Navigation System was installed, replacing SINS.

A new propeller was installed on the shaft.

OTCIXS was installed allowing over-the-horizon targeting.

- 2. Most of 1986 was spent making preparations for the deployment to the Mediterranean. This included several trips to the underwater ranges at St. Croix and at AUTEC. On these ranges, PHILADELPHIA conducted extensive sound trials along with weapon certification and weapon system certification. The ship had to prove that it could successfully launch all weapons carried, including the Mk 48 torpedo, the Harpoon anti-ship missile, and the Tomahawk cruise missile.
- 3. Also done during the year was an operational reactor safeguards exam (ORSE) to ensure that the propulsion plant was being operated safely. An INSURV inspection in June inspected the material readiness of the ship.

1. Awards received from the Mediterranean deployment include: Meritorious Unit Commendation, the Sixth Fleet HOOK 'EM award and CTF 69 Clean Sweep Broom for ASW excellence, to recognize the best of the best fast attack submarines.

- 2. PCO operations in May were conducted with two other submarines at the AUTEC range. All three submarines had PCO's aboard.
- 3. The exercise Agile Player was a surprise exercise in which all the submarines in New London were underway within 24 hours. There was no advance notice. PHILADELPHIA was able to get underway within 24 hours from a full upkeep status due to a herculean effort by the entire crew. Everything disassembled needed to be put back together, the reactor plant needed to be heated up, stores loaded and all personnel ready for underway, all in less than 24 hours. While underway for this exercise, PHILADELPHIA performed operations with Navy, Coast Guard and Air National Guard units.
- 4. During the course of the year, PHILADELPHIA had over 100 exercise weapons shot at her and she in turn shot I training Tomahawk, I training Harpoon, and over 40 Mk 48 torpedoes.

Part C: NARRATIVE

1. Awards and Distinctions received:

- a. PHILADELPHIA received the ASW "A" from COMSUBDEVRON TWELVE for 1988 for the second year in a row.
- b. PHILADELPHIA was a Tactical Readiness Examination "Top Performer" for 1988.
- c. PHILADELPHIA was the first submarine to receive TLAM-D capability.
  - d. Received the Supply Blue "E" for excellence.
- 2. Midshipmen were aboard during August operations on AUTEC Underwater Range while the ship performed weapons certifications.
- 3. LANTSUBASWEX 1-89 was performed to test very short range tactics in a close encounter between two submarines. Both submarines would detect each other at nearly the same time and at very short range. Out of the geometries run and the situations set up, came many lessons learned and a major contribution to tactical development in this area. Several dozen exercise Mk 48 and ADCAP torpedoes were fired during the exercise and much data was collected and later evaluated to develop more precise tactical guidance for these situations.
