III. NARRATIVE

USS BUFFALO started out the year preparing for deployment and departed Pearl Harbor, HI on 28 February. During our deployment we participated in four SEATO Joint Exercises and performed a unusual 60 day deployment in support of SEVENTH Fleet.

During a well deserved Post Deployment stand down the ship completed change of command.

IV. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

BIOGRAPHY OF THE COMMANDING OFFICER

Commander John E. Cohoon, Jr., a native of Long Island, New York, graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1978 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. Following commissioning he attended Naval Nuclear Power school in Orlando, Florida, the Nuclear Power Training Unit at Ballston Spa, New York, and the Submarine Officer's Basic Course in New London, Connecticut.

His first assignment was to the Gold crew of the Fleet Ballistic Missile Submarine USS NATHAN HALE (SSBN 623) where he served in a variety of division jobs from April 1980 to June 1983. The NATHAN HALE won the Submarine Squadron 18 Battle Efficiency "E" during his time on board. Commander Cohoon's next assignment was as the First Company Officer at the United States Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland. During this tour he received a Master of Science degree in Administration from Central Michigan University. Following his tour at the Naval Academy he attended the Submarine Officer's Advanced Course in New London, Connecticut.

Commander Cohoon was next assigned to the USS L. MENDEL RIVERS (SSN 686) where he served as Navigator and Combat Systems Officer from August 1986 until September 1988. The L. MENDEL RIVERS won the Submarine Squadron 4 Battle Efficiency "E" twice during his tour. His next assignment was as Engineer Officer on the Fleet Ballistic Missile Submarine USS CASIMIR PULASKI (SSBN 633) GOLD where he served from September 1988 until September 1990. During this assignment the CASIMIR PULASKI won the Submarine Squadron 16 Battle Efficiency "E" and the Atlantic Fleet Ballistic Missile Submarine of the Year award for 1989. Commander Cohoon then served as Executive Officer on board the USS HOUSTON (SSN 713) from September 1990 to November 1992. During this tour the HOUSTON completed a shipyard period and held

many 688 class submarine firsts including swimmer, mining and battle group operations.

Commander Cohoon's next assignment was as a student in the senior class at the United States Naval War College, Newport, Rhode Island where he graduated in November 1993 with a Master of Arts Degree in National and Security Studies.

Commander Cohoon has been awarded the Navy Commendation Medal (three awards) and the Navy Achievement Medal (three awards).

Commander Cohoon is married to the former Barbara Dixon of Andover, Massachusetts. They currently reside on Ford Island in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii with their sons Andrew and Marshall.
