1. Command Composition and Organization. USS BUFFALO (SSN 715) is a Los Angeles Class Fast Attack Submarine home-ported in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. BUFFALO's ISIC is Submarine Squadron ONE. CDR Ralph C. Ward, USN, is the Commanding Officer.

3. Narrative. USS BUFFALO began 2001 preparing for a Western Pacific Deployment. The pre-overseas movement (POM) process started with the POM I upkeep period at the Pearl Harbor Intermediate Maintenance Facility (IMF). Underway training commenced with Dry Deck Shelter (DDS) refresher training and independent certification. The DDS was removed for the remainder of the POM period. The fleet exercise Silent Fury gave Buffalo an opportunity to interact with surface, sub, and air assets in further preparation for deployment. The POM process culminated with final repairs in the POM II upkeep and successful certification by the ISIC.

Additionally, integrated into the POM period, BUFFALO conducted a number of tests and inspections in preparation for the ship's Engineered Refueling Overhaul scheduled to begin shortly after the deployment.

Subj: USS BUFFALO (SSN 715) COMMAND HISTORY

On 14 July 2001, BUFFALO transited to the Seventh Fleet AOR and commenced a six-month Western Pacific deployment by participating in the tactical development exercise SHAREM-138. The Surface Warfare Development Group conducted the exercise that included U.S./Japanese surface, sub, and air assets. Following a personnel transfer in Okinawa, BUFFALO proceeded to Yokosuka, Japan for a brief repair period.

BUFFALO then conducted special operations in the Seventh Fleet AOR and upon completion, proceeded to Guam for the first-ever forward deployed submarine Dry Deck Shelter onload.

With the shelter loaded, BUFFALO commenced several weeks of DDS operations with Seal Delivery Vehicle Team One (SDVT-1) and members of Naval Special Warfare Unit One and deployed personnel from Seal Team One. The exercises ranged in scope from basic familiarization to simulated full mission profiles. The ship was able to smoothly transition into the SPECWAR role, demonstrating the diversity and flexibility of a modern SSN.

Following DDS Operations, BUFFALO conducted special operations in the Seventh Fleet AOR, returning once again to Guam for voyage repairs and additional SPECWAR exercises.

On 19 November 2001, BUFFALO departed Guam for the last time and conducted several weeks of special operations in the Seventh Fleet AOR.

After the special operations, BUFFALO proceeded to Yokosuka for a holiday inport period and to conduct voyage repairs.

BUFFALO closed out 2001 enroute to Pearl Harbor and the completion of a successful deployment.

The year was filled with operational commitments. The ship and crew performed superbly throughout the year and earned several awards recognizing her strong performance. BUFFALO was awarded the Commander Submarine Squadron One 2001 Battle Efficiency "E" and Navigation Red and Green "N" for operational and navigation excellence.
