USS GEORGIA (SSBN 729)

BLUE CREW

(U) The first part of 1988 was spent in off-ship training in preparation for the crew's next patrol.

(C) In March 1988 the Blue Crew relieved the Gold Crew and began the ship's thirteenth refit. Following completion of the refit period, USS GEORGIA departed on patrol 13. The ship was honored to have COMSUBGRU 9, Rear Admiral Davis, onboard for the mod-alert training period at the beginning of the patrol.

(C) Patrol 13 was a test of the character and quality of the Blue Crew and was marked by many significant accomplishments including:

- Completion of a Tactical Readiness Evaluation with a grade of Above Average
- Completion of a surprise Operational Reactor Safeguards Examination with a grade of Average
- Completion of a combined Defense Nuclear Surety Inspection/Navy Technical Proficiency Inspection with a grade of outstanding
- Completion of a Supply Management Inspection with a grade of Excellent.

(U) From July through September 1988 the Blue Crew conducted an off-ship training period in preparation for the ship's fifteenth patrol.

(C) In October 1988 the Blue Crew relieved the Gold Crew and successfully completed Refit and Patrol 15. The ship returned from patrol in December. Following completion of this patrol, three junior officers qualified to wear the gold dolphin insignia.
