1. The following information and enclosures (1) through (4) are submitted per reference (a).

2. Command Composition and Organization

a. USS GREENEVILLE (SSN 772) is a multi-mission capable, nuclear powered, fast attack submarine. GREENEVILLE is certified to perform anti-submarine warfare, anti-surface warfare, special operations insertion and extraction, TOMAHAWK missile strikes and Mother Submarine (MOSUB) operations. She is one of two platforms that can operate the Advanced SEAL Delivery System (ASDS), an innovative new special operations vehicle.

b. GREENEVILLE's immediate superior in command is Commander, Submarine Squadron ONE. She was commanded until 09 July by Commander Lindsay R. Hankins, and commanded during the remainder of the year by Commander Lorin C. Selby. GREENEVILLE is homeported at Naval Station, Pearl Harbor, HI.

4. Narrative

a. GREENEVILLE began 2004 on deployment, in transit from 7th Fleet to 5th Fleet in order to join Expeditionary Strike Group ONE (ESG-1) in the Global War on Terrorism. The ship met up with ESG-1 in Djibouti on 09 Jan to conduct a brief stop for personnel (BSP). GREENEVILLE then conducted special operations vital to national security until 18 Jan.

b. After conducting another BSP in Djibouti on 19 Jan, GREENEVILLE and ESG-1 began the long transit back to Pearl Harbor. On the way, GREENEVILLE conducted a quality of life port visit and upkeep in Guam from 09-19 Feb.

c. Following Guam, GREENEVILLE transited back to the homeport of Pearl Harbor, returning from deployment on 27 February. The deployment was an incredible success, demonstrating the interoperability of the Submarine Force with Naval Special Forces and Amphibious Forces, and validating the submarine's role in the Global War on Terrorism.

d. GREENEVILLE conducted a post deployment stand down from 27 Feb to 28 March while moored at Pearl Harbor.

e. Following stand down, the ship conducted weapons off load and returned to sea on 06 April. On April 9th, GREENEVILLE had the pleasure of hosting The Honorable Congressman Ed Case, Hawaii's congressman from Second Congressional District. Congressman Case and 14 guests spent the day underway, where we demonstrated some of the many capabilities of the submarine force.

f. From April 29 to May 1, the ship conducted an Operational Reactor Safeguards Examination administered by the COMPACFLT Nuclear Power Examination Board. The ship received the highest possible grade on this major inspection.

g. In May and June, GREENEVILLE conducted a Basic Submarining Assessment, administered by Commander, Submarine Squadron ONE. This examination evaluated the ship in all operational areas, and set the baseline level of operational proficiency for the remainder of the interdeployment training cycle. The ship was evaluated as satisfactory, and graded as at or above standards in all mission areas.

h. Following BSA, the ship entered upkeep at SUBASE Pearl Harbor. During this upkeep, Commander Lindsay Hankins was relieved as Commanding Officer, USS GREENEVILLE (SSN 772) by Commander Lorin Selby on 9 July in a ceremony held onboard USS GREENEVILLE.

i. After completing upkeep, the ship participated in the underway portion of the Submarine Command Course (SCC) operations. This course trains all prospective submarine commanding officers and executive officers in the tactics of front line submarine operations. The course was very successful and provided excellent training for both the SCC students and the crew of USS GREENEVILLE.

j. Following two brief periods of Commanding Officer's Discretionary Time (CODT) in late August and early September, GREENEVILLE entered upkeep at the Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard in drydock 2. During this upkeep, the ship completed highly complex reactor plant maintenance, and upgraded several systems. The ship left drydock on 23 November, and conducted sea trials on 13 December.

k. Sea trials included post-maintenance shakedown CODT and training operations with the USS BUFFALO 15-16 December. GREENEVILLE returned to port 17 December to enter a holiday stand-down period.

i. USS GREENEVILLE finished 2004 at Naval Station Pearl Harbor.
