

NARRATIVE

In August of 1995, USS HONOLULU departed Hawaii for her first six month Western Pacific Deployment in over four years. HONOLULU spent the holiday season in Guam USA for liberty and an upkeep. Additionally, the ship visited Yokosuka, Singapore, and Pattaya Beach, Thailand. The final liberty call before returning home was a week stop in Brisbane, Australia. The deployment finished up with an Operational Reactors Safeguards Exam, in which the ship performed exceptionally well. She returned to Pearl Harbor on February 7, 1996.

After a much needed stand down in February and a post deployment upkeep in March, HONOLULU returned to sea in April and may to provide support to the USS TAUTOG, USS PASADENA and USS HENRY M JACKSON. Five days were spent showing the families of the HONOLULU a piece of our lives during the 1996 Dependents Cruise. After a nine hour underway, the ship anchored off of Lahaina, Maui for a relaxing week in the sun.

May and June included the annual Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC) exercise. HONOLULU was assigned as a member of the Independence Battlegroup, getting invaluable experience in battlegroup operations. Directly following RIMPAC the ship conducted an extensive upkeep and Change of Command. On June 28, 1996 Commander Cecil D Haney relieved CAPT (SEL) David L. Jones as Commanding Officer of USS HONOLULU. Guest speaker was CAPT Bruce B. Englehardt, Commodore, Submarine Squadron SEVEN.

HONOLULU participated in numerous inspections, including Tactical Weapons Proficiency, Tactical Readiness Examination, and Operational Reactor Safeguards Exam. Inspections were in preparation for an upcoming deployment and the ship performed excellent on all. During December, the ship spent two weeks in a holiday standdown and celebrated the Christmas season with a Ship's Holiday Party.
