COMMAND HISTORY
USS JARRETT (FFG-33)
CALENDAR YEAR 1989

1. Command Composition and Organization.

The mission of the USS JARRETT (FFG 33) is to conduct worldwide prompt and sustained combat operations at sea, in support of national policy. The ship contributes to accomplishing the functions of sea control, with its lesser included function of sea denial and projecting naval power from those areas under United States control. The FFG-7 Class Guided Missile Frigate is fully capable of operation as a member of a Battle Group, or assignment to protect amphibious task groups, underway replenishment groups or convoys.

USS JARRETT (FFG 33) is currently assigned to Destroyer Squadron Thirty Three and is commanded by CDR Bruce B. Giannotti.

During the calendar year 1989, USS JARRETT (FFG 33) continued its Extended Dry Docking Selected Restricted Availability (EDSRA) at Southwest Marine Shipyard, San Pedro, CA. Southwest Marine commenced repairs in the shipyard on 16 November, 1988. USS JARRETT was drydocked from 10 January 1989 until 03 April 1989 during which time major structural work was accomplished. Major installations during EDSRA include:

AN/SQQ 89 V(2) with SQR-19 Tactical Towed Array Sonar (TACTAS) (Ship Alt 117), Fin Stabilizers (Ship Alt 001), Light Airborne Multi Purpose System (LAMPS) MK III (Ship Alt 006), Recovery Assist and Traversing (RAST) (Ship Alt 004), Ship's Service Diesel Generator (SSDG) Rotor Replacement (Ship Alt 103), Halon Upgrade (Ship Alt 067), Aqueous Film Forming Foam (AFFF) Bilge Sprinkler Upgrade (Ship Alt 070), and a 4100 Ton Mod Upgrade (Ship Alt 110).

EDSRA work continued throughout the summer and on 01 September, 1989, CDR Bruce B. Giannotti relieved CDR Carl E. Weiscopef as Commanding Officer, USS JARRETT (FFG 33). In addition to passing its Propulsion Light Off Exam in early October, Combat Systems Testing was completed on 15 December. On 27 November, CDR Giannotti was temporarily relieved of command by CDR Steven J. Busch in order to undergo neck surgery. CDR Giannotti relieved CDR Busch as Commanding Officer USS JARRETT (FFG 33) on 09 March, 1990. Sea trials occurred in early December and JARRETT returned to Naval Station, Long Beach on 06 December. Southwest Marine delivered USS JARRETT (FFG 33) on 08 December, 1989.
