COMMAND HISTORY - 1992

1. Command Composition and Organization:

Commander Houston K. Jones, USN, commands USS MIAMI (SSN 755) homeported at Groton, CT, with Commander Submarine Development Squadron TWELVE as his immediate superior in command.

2. Chronology:

01JAN Ship is in holiday routine in homeport.
02JAN Holiday routine ends.
07JAN Ship is underway for Kings Bay, GA.
10JAN Moored Kings Bay, GA Trident Refit wharf for upkeep.
13JAN Shifted berths, entered Trident Refit Facility drydock.
30JAN Ship is afloat, shifted berths to Trident Refit wharf.
03FEB Underway for Groton, CT.
10FEB Moored Subase, Groton, CT.
25FEB Underway for Exercise TEAMWORK 92.
15MAR Ship conducts MEDEVAC in Trondheim Fjord, Trondheim, Norway.
17MAR Ship crossed the Arctic Circle and is visited by Boreas Rex.
26MAR Moored Trondheim, Norway for port visit.
27MAR Ship is boarded by two Norwegian Citizens protesting the presence of a nuclear-powered ship in their country. Norwegian police remove the protesters without incident.
31MAR Underway to Groton, CT.
10APR Moored in homeport.

01MAY Transferred from Commander Submarine Squadron TWO to Commander Submarine Development Squadron TWELVE as ISIC.

27MAY Completed upkeep.

28MAY Ship is underway for operations at Acoustic Underwater Test and Evaluation Center (AUTEK) in the Bahamas.

05JUN Ship is moored at Port Canaveral, FL for port visit.

09JUN Ship is underway for Norfolk, VA.

12JUN Ship is moored at Norfolk N.O.B., Norfolk, VA.

15JUN Shift berth to deperming crib, Lamberts Point, Norfolk, VA for flash deperm treatment.

17JUN Deperm complete. Underway for NSWC Fort Lauderdale, FL magnetic range for testing.

22JUN Moored at Port Everglades, FL for port visit.

25JUN Underway for Tactical Development Exercise in the Narragansett Bay Operating Areas (NBOAs).

29JUN Moored at USN/NUSC pier, New London, CT.

30JUN Underway for Operational Reactor Safeguards Exam.

01JUL ORSE complete. Moored at Subase Groton, CT for upkeep.

29JUL Underway for Tactical Development Exercise in the Boston Operating Areas.

03AUG Moored at Subase Groton, CT.

13AUG Underway for AUTEK.

26AUG Moored Subase Kings Bay, GA outboard of USS CANOPUS, for port call.

28AUG Underway for AUTEK.

09SEP Moored at Subase Kings Bay, GA Trident Refit wharf.

10SEP Shifted berths, entered the TRF drydock for repairs.

14SEP Ship is afloat. Shifted berths to TRF wharf.

15SEP Underway for Groton, CT.

18SEP Moored at Subase Groton, CT for Pre-Overseas Movement (POM) upkeep.

21OCT Underway for AUTEK and Tactical Readiness Exam (TRE).

28OCT TRE complete.

30OCT Moored at Port Everglades, FL for port visit.

02NOV Commanding Officer, Executive Officer and several Crewmembers visited the ship's adopted school, Madie Ives Elementary in Miami, FL for USS MIAMI Appreciation Day.

03NOV Underway for Kings Bay, GA.

04NOV Moored at Kings Bay, GA outboard USS CANOPUS.

05NOV Shifted berths, entered ARDM drydock for repairs.

09NOV Ship is afloat. Shifted berths to Lay Berths.

10NOV Underway to Groton, CT.

13NOV Moored at Subase Groton for POM loadout.

30NOV Underway for the Mediterranean Sea.

18DEC Inchop to COMSIXTHFLT. Entered the Mediterranean Sea, under operational control of CTF 69.

31DEC Underway in the Mediterranean Sea.

3. Narrative: Upon completion of holiday standdown, USS Miami began 1992 with an upkeep and drydocking in Kings Bay, GA. This was the first of three visits to Kings Bay for drydocking in an effort to correct a noise problem noted by the ship.

The ship then participated in Exercise Teamwork 92, a major NATO exercise involving coordinated operation with the navies of several NATO countries. Highlights of this operation for the crew included the chance to become "Bluenoses" in a ceremony held when

the ship crossed the Arctic Circle, and a port visit to Trondheim, Norway. Upon return to homeport, Miami conducted a routine upkeep and, on 01 MAY 1992, transferred to Submarine Development Squadron TWELVE.

The ship had a busy summer, conducting testing at various Navy ranges, providing services to other submarines involved in training, and participating in Tactical Development Exercises. Miami also underwent her first flash deperm treatment for reduction of magnetic signature.

In September Pre-Overseas Movement (POM) preparations began, and continued through November. In the midst of these preps, Miami conducted a Tactical Readiness Exam and a port visit to Port Everglades, FL, where the crew renewed acquaintances with students at the Madie Ives Elementary School in Miami, FL, USS MIAMI's "adopted" grade school.

Following Thanksgiving weekend in homeport, MIAMI got underway for her first deployment, remaining at sea for the rest of the year.
