### III. (U) OPERATIONS HISTORY

The "Bullseye Hummers" opened 1978 in Genoa, Italy with three months of their Mediterranean deployment behind them. During January the squadron provided range surveillance and LINK II targeting data for the USS AMERICA (CV 66) missile shoot at Salto Di Quirra range. The "Bullseye Hummers" also directed a SAR effort to assist a burning merchant ship off the coast of Sicily.

In February, AMERICA participated in National Week XXIV. During this period VAW 124 flew 73 straight hours with 100 per cent AEW coverage. Following National Week XXIV, AMERICA made a port call to Palma, Mallorca.

In March the "Bullseye Hummers" were busy. The squadron helped in implementing over-the-horizon targeting for the harpoon missile. One aircraft was detached to Zaragoza to assist in controlling DACM between F15's and F14's. During this time Air Force controllers were given hands-on experience in the E-2C Hawkeye.

In April, while visiting Valencia, Spain VAW 124 detached another aircraft, this time to NAS Rota to control DACM between USN F14's and Spanish AV8's. On 15 April 78 the USS AMERICA was relieved by the USS FORRESTAL and departed Rota for CONUS. On 25 April 78 USS AMERICA arrived at Pier 12 NOB Norfolk, Virginia.

Most of May was devoted to a stand-down period for the squadron. At the end of the month the "Bullseye Hummers" participated in AVELEX 1-78 with various Marine squadrons out of USMCAS Cherry Point, NC.

During June VAW 124 participated in a MISSILEX in the Vacapes area, a War-at-Sea exercise at Cecil Field, and AVELEX 2-78 in Beaufort, SC. This second AVELEX was highly successful and included squadrons of F-4's, AV8, A4M's and A6E's from the US Marine Corps, A7E's from the Air National Guard, and F-15's from the US Air Force. At the end of June two aircraft were detached to NAS Bermuda for Operation Whaletail.

July started with Operation Whaletail continuing from NAS Bermuda. During this period, the "Bullseye Hummers" on two occasions successfully intercepted Soviet Bear D aircraft with an EA3 from VAQ 33. These were the first time such intercepts were attempted and their success was gratifying to all concerned.

The "Bullseye Hummers" spent much of August at NAS Norfolk conducting ground training. Some LINK II training flights were conducted with FLECOMBATTRACENLANT. The squadron was also on alert status in conjunction with SOPWITH CAMEL.

In September VAW 124 increased its pace of operations. Numerous war-at-sea exercises and missile exercises were supported, along with a CARQUAL period aboard the USS NIMITZ. A detachment was also sent to NAS Fallon to support CVW 11 Strikex's.

October saw much of the same type of mission tasking as September. At the end of the month, the squadron went to NAS Fallon to support CVW 11 as a weapons detachment.

In November the weapons detachment continued through the first week. Following that, there was a standdown period for ground training, followed by the start of TYT-I with CVW 6.

TYT-I continued into the first week of December. While on TYT-I with CVW 6 aboard the USS AMERICA, the squadron was notified of its selection for CNAL's Battle Efficiency "E" for 1978. On 15 December CDR J. R. CONDON was relieved by CDR J. R. SLAUGHTER as Commanding Officer of VAW 124.

#### IV. MAINTENANCE HISTORY

The nineteen seventy eight maintenance effort was characterized by about an even split between continuous at sea and ashore maintenance support. Through a demanding operational schedule, outstanding improvements were continued in operationally ready aircraft and full systems capability performance, bringing both to an all time high of 87 percent and 71 percent respectively.

Two new aircraft transitioned through the squadron as the scheduled depot level maintenance cycle was met. Both these aircraft were fresh out of a modernization and update program. The average onboard inventory was four E-2C aircraft.

#### V. SAFETY SQUADRON HISTORY

During the period 1 JAN - 31 DEC 1978, VAW 124 completed 1876 accident free hours. July 21, 1978 marked the seventh year of accident free operations totaling 10,515 hours. These achievements were a direct result of an aggressive safety awareness program that is evident at all levels of command within the squadron. Further proof of the squadron's outstanding safety awareness was given when it was awarded the coveted Chief of Naval Operations Annual Aviation Safety Award for 1978. The real payoff for the many hours of education and briefings this year was the fact that no person was seriously injured in the line of duty.
