STRIKE FIGHTER SQUADRON 22 NARRATIVE FOR 1992

THE YEAR OF 1992 BEGAN WITH STRIKE FIGHTER SQUADRON 22 GOING BACK TO SEA ABOARD USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN. THIS WAS FOLLOWED BY NUMEROUS DETACHMENTS BEGINNING WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE AIR FORCE FIGHTER WEAPONS SCHOOL AT NELLIS AIR FORCE BASE. FOLLOWING THIS WAS A DETACHMENT TO CANADA, THE AARP DET AND SFARP. CLOSING UP THE YEAR WERE REFRESHER TRAINING ON THE ABRAHAM LINCOLN AND THE AIR WING DETACHMENT TO NAS FALLON NEVADA.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR INCLUDE:

JANUARY

FOLLOWING THE HOLIDAY SEASON THE REDCOCKS JUMPED RIGHT INTO THE TURN AROUND TRAINING CYCLE WITH A TRIP BACK TO CVN-72 FOR A SHORT AT SEA PERIOD WORKING WITH CVW-11 ONCE AGAIN.

FEBRUARY

THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY SAW THE FIRST TWO NEW PILOTS IN THE SQUADRON SINCE PRIOR TO THE LAST CRUISE. THE SQUADRON LOST THREE OF ITS MOST EXPERIENCED JUNIOR OFFICERS. THIS TREND WAS TO CONTINUE IN THE FOLLOWING MONTHS AS THE SQUADRON WOULD EXPERIENCE AN ALMOST COMPLETE TURNOVER OF JUNIOR OFFICERS.

MARCH

THE MONTH OF MARCH PROVED TO BE A SLOW MONTH FOR THE REDCOCKS. THE FIRST DETACHMENTS OF THE TURNAROUND CYCLE OCCURRED DURING MARCH AS DID THE TRAINING OF THE NEW SQUADRON LEGAL OFFICER AND THE NEW AIR TO AIR WEAPONS TRAINING OFFICER.

APRIL

DURING APRIL, IN ADDITION TO THE ASSORTED DET'S AND STRIKES, THE SQUADRON ALSO HAD THE TASK OF INDOCTRINATING AND BRINGING UP-TO-SPEED TWO NEW PILOTS. AS OLD SQUADRON MEMBERS LEAVE AND NEW ONES ARRIVE THE REDCOCKS PREPARE FOR WHAT LOOKS TO BE A BUSY SUMMER.

MAY

THE MONTH OF MAY WAS A TRAGIC TIME FOR THE REDCOCKS AS THE SQUADRON MOURNED THE LOSS OF LCDR MCGUIRE. LCDR MCGUIRE'S PRESENCE IN THE SQUADRON WILL BE GREATLY MISSED, HE WAS ONE OF THE FA-18 COMMUNITIES AND NAVAL AVIATION'S FINEST. THE MONTH CAME TO A CLOSE ON A MORE POSITIVE NOTE WITH THE AWARDING OF THE BATTLE "E" AND A ZERO, ZERO NTPI.

JUNE

AS OPTAR IS STILL AVAILABLE THE REDCOCKS FOUND THEMSELVES TRAINING HARD WITH THE ADDITIONAL FLIGHT TIME. THIS MADE FOR A BUSY MONTH FOR ALL HANDS. AS JULY APPROACHES THE SQUADRON PREPARES FOR UPCOMING DETS AND THE BEGINNING OF WORK-UPS IN THE FALL.

JULY

JULY MARKED THE FIRST OF THE SUMMER'S NUMEROUS DETACHMENTS WITH A TRIP TO COLD LAKE CANADA IN SUPPORT OF THE CANADIAN FIGHTER WEAPONS SCHOOL. UPON RETURN TO LEMOORE THE SQUADRON BEGAN AARP GROUND SCHOOL FOR THE UPCOMING AARP DETACHMENT TO INDIAN SPRINGS NV.

AUGUST

THE MONTH OF AUGUST OFFICIALLY SIGNALLED THE START OF WORKUPS. THE FIRST DETACHMENT IN THE WORKUP CYCLE CONSISTED OF NINE DAYS IN INDIAN SPRINGS EMPLOYING AIR TO GROUND TACTICS WHILE BEING OBSERVED BY STRIKE FIGHTER WING PACIFIC. THE DETACHMENT WAS A COMPLETE SUCCESS.

SEPTEMBER

WITH THE COMPLETION OF SFARP THE SQUADRON HAS COMPLETED ANOTHER PHASE OF THE WORKUP CURRICULUM AND IS NOW FULLY PREPARED TO INTEGRATE WITH THE AIRWING. AS THE SQUADRON HAS BEEN SHORT HANDED THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER THE PROMISE OF TWO NEW PILOTS IN THE NEAR FUTURE IS MUCH ANTICIPATED AS THE REDCOCKS PREPARE FOR THEIR FIRST AT-SEA PERIOD IN OVER NINE MONTHS.

OCTOBER

THE SQUADRON'S FIRST AT-SEA PERIOD OF THE WORKUP SCHEDULE GAVE THE REDCOCKS THEIR FIRST TASTE OF THE CARRIER OPERATING ENVIRONMENT SINCE LAST JANUARY. UPON COMPLETING CARRIER QUALIFICATIONS THE SQUADRON PARTICIPATED IN CYCLIC OPERATIONS GIVING THE NEW MEMBERS OF THE SQUADRON THEIR FIRST TASTE OF AIR WING OPERATIONS.

NOVEMBER

DURING NOVEMBER THE SQUADRON STUMBLED SLIGHTLY BY FAILING THE CWTPI. THE PROBLEM WAS QUICKLY RECTIFIED AND THE INSPECTION PASSED. BECAUSE OF THE FAST PACED SCHEDULE THE REDCOCKS HAD LITTLE TIME TO DWELL ON THEIR MISFORTUNE. THE FALLON AIRWING DET WAS JUST AROUND THE CORNER FOLLOWED BY THE HOLIDAYS.

DECEMBER

NARRATIVE: DECEMBER COMMENCED WITH THE AIR WING DETACHMENT TO NAS FALLON. DURING THE DETACHMENT THE SQUADRON FLEW DAY AND NIGHT AIR WING STRIKES AND CLOSE AIR SUPPORT AS PART OF AN INTEGRATED AIRWING. DESPITE THE WEATHER WHICH CAUSED THE CANCELLATION OF NUMEROUS EVENTS THE DETACHMENT WAS A VALUABLE LEARNING EXPERIENCE.
