HIGHLIGHTS

CBMU-302 officially joined the Pacific Fleet on 31 March 1967 along with its sister Unit CBMU-301, the first of their kind since the Korean War. LT M. H. HARPER, CEC, USN, assumed duties as Commanding Officer. The official commissioning ceremony of CBMU-301 and CBMU-302 was held at Port Hueneme with RADM Eli T. REICH, USN, acting as Commissioning Officer. Shortly thereafter LT HARPER departed TEMDU with COMCBPAC and NSA SGN to plan the expected deployment of the Unit to Vietnam. While awaiting deployment orders during June and July the Unit embarked upon a program of accelerated military training at Conejo Grade and Camp Pendleton, California. On 1 July LT M. H. HARPER was promoted to Lieutenant Commander.

On August 12, 1967, COMCBPAC MSG 120558Z directed the deployment of fifty men from CBMU-302 to the Naval Support Activity Detachment located at Cam Ranh Bay in the II Corps Tactical Zone of Vietnam. LTJG B. B. EMORY, CEC, USN, Officerin-Charge, departed with an advance party of fifty men on 16 August 1967 aboard an airlift provided by VR-21. Their arrival on 19 August gave them the distinction of being the first SEABEE Command to be deployed in II, III, and IV CTZ, and also the first SEABEE Command in Vietnam to provide support for seagoing Navy Units and their advanced bases.

COMCBPAC MSG 262351Z directed the deployment of the main body to Cam Rahn Bay, Vietnam, on or about 15 September 1967. The main body was airlifted by VR-21 from Port Hueneme, California, to Cam Rahn Bay, Vietnam.

Upon Main Body's arrival in Vietnam, two Details were formed and deployed to Nha Trang and Qui Nhon, Vietnam. The ten man Nha Trang Detail was to support Inshore Underwater Group One (IUWG-1) in Nha Trang. The Qui Nhon Detail was tasked with maintenance support of NSA SGN Detachment, Coastal Division 13, the IUWG Unit and Coastal Surveillance Center (CSC).

During this time the Main Body in Cam Ranh Bay was awaiting the arrival of the S.S. VANTAGE PROGRESS, which carried the Unit's building, automotive and construction equipment. The ship arrived on 7 October. With the ship soon offloaded, the first item of business was to construct a four building maintenance complex which would ultimately become the Public Works shops for the Base Camp site. By mid-November three of the four buildings had been completed and occupied by 302: the Admin building, the Supply warehouse and the Bravo company shops. In November the first contact by CBMU-302 personnel with the Viet Cong occurred at Qui Nhon, with no injuries to Unit personnel.

December saw the completion of the new Automotive shop building at CRB. On 17 December BUC WOLFE deployed with a detail of twenty men to Sa Dec and Vinh Long, two "Game Warden" bases located 10 miles apart on the Mekong River. On the night of 22-23 December the second VC attack on Qui Nhon brought the first casualties for CBMU-302. The VC detonated an explosive charge against the barracks berthing CBMU personnel, critically injuring EOC R. L. SEARS, who was subsequently med-evacued to Japan, and CET3 SNYDER and CS2 TURNAGE who both suffered light to moderate injuries. All three were awarded the Purple Heart as a result of their action.

On 24 January 1968 a project was started at NSA Det Sa Dec to provide new living quarters, new administrative and supply spaces, and a new armory. The project included demolition of existing buildings which were substandard and overcrowded. During construction of the "Sa Dec Hilton" personnel lived in tents.

In February a permanent detail was extablished at Dong Tam/My Tho which are Game Warden bases in the Mekong Delta area 45 miles SW of Saigon. A temporary detail was sent to Vung Ro to construct storage and shop spaces and install a pontoon pier for the newly established Unit-5 of IUWG-1 WestPacDet. The Viet Cong offensive disrupted work at all sites during this month. At Cam Ranh Bay the Base was placed on a four day yellow alert for the first time ever because of a rocket attack on the peninsula. The Navy base at Vinh Long, where nine CBM U-302 personnel were deployed, was attacked and, after several days of fighting, overrun. The Base was reoccupied a few days later.

RADM HEAMAN, COMCBPAC, visited CRB and inspected CBMU-302 facilities on 23 April. During this month the Unit completed construction of a 60' watch tower at NAVCOMSTA, CRB. The tower was the first of several planned for the area.

A major soil-cement stabilization project at NSF, CRB, was started and work was completed on the dynamometer and engine test stand. On 15 May the Dong Tam Detail completed the construction of a firemain system at NSA Det Dong Tam. This important Mekong Delta base is subject to frequent mortar and rocket attacks, and previously there was no adequate fire fighting system. On 29 May LTJG H. A. CORBIN, CEC, USNR, the first new Officer to join the Unit since commissioning, reported aboard.

In June a 17 man detail travelled from Cam Ranh Bay to the newly established maintenance and minor construction Detail at Cat Lo/Vung Tau. Shortly there after the Unit was assigned a major construction project consisting of providing shelters (roof and three sides) for eight 50' x 128' ammo storage pads. On 25 June three new Officers reported aboard, LT B. W. SIMMONS, CEC, USN, assumed the duties of Executive Officer, LTJG R. C. BOND, SC, USN, relieved LT D. N. WINDAU as Supply Officer, and LTJG M. T. NIELSEN, CEC, USNR, began preparing to be Officer-in-Charge of the Binh Thuy Detail to be deployed in July.


Another Detail deployed to An Thoi on 3 July to construct a 40' x 100' warehouse/garage. Two days later a twenty man Detail headed by LTJG M. T. NIELSEN deployed to NSA Det Binh Thuy. Construction began on the eight 50' x 128' ammo storage pad shelters at Cam Ranh Bay. Five were completed in one month with the crew working about 25% ahead of schedule. On 4 July eight CBMU-302 men aboard a MAC flight enroute to Vietnam were forced down by Soviet jets over a Communist controlled island near Japan. They reported aboard two days later after their release, all in good shape.

ENS P. H. DURAND, CEC, USNR, reported for duty on 3 August, followed 3 days later by LTJG B. R. LAURSEN, CEC, USNR, who assumed duties of Operations/Engineering Officer. ENS DURAND was temporarily assigned as project manager in the Engineering Department. On 17 August the last of eight 50' x 128' ammo storage pad shelters was completed, 13 days ahead of schedule. LTJG T. G. SMITH, CEC, USNR, reported for duty 20 August as LTJG F. B. BANKERT's relief. LCDR H. W. FILBRY, CEC, USN, reported aboard 23 August to begin indoctrination as LCDR HARPER's relief as Commanding Officer.

LCDR H. W. FILBRY relieved LCDR M. H. HARPER as Commanding Officer of CBMU-302 in change of command ceremonies at Cam Ranh Bay on 2 September 1968. CAPT M. C. DUNCAN, Commander NavaI Support Activity, Saigon, was guest speaker. CBMU-302 was awarded the Navy Unit Commendation during the change of command ceremony for the period 18 September 1967 to 1 January 1968. LCDR M. H. HARPER was awarded the Bronze Star with Combat "V". CUCM C. N. BOCK reported aboard for duties as Shops Officer 17 September 1968.


VADM E. R. ZUMWALT, COMNAVFORV, visited CBMU-302 in October followed by CAPT CASTANES, new Public Works Officer, NSA SGN, and then CAPT C. G. MILLER, Chief of Staff, COMCBPAC. Heavy rains and strong wind struck the CRB area. Considerable damage was done to roads to the Naval Support Facility and Naval Communication Station. The advance party for Detail Golf deployed to the Naval Air Facility, CRB on 29 October.

On 9 November the Enlisted Men's Club at Naval Support Facility, CRB, was sufficiently completed to allow occupancy. Typhoon Mami caused erosion at several areas at CRB, including roads to NSF. On 16 November the special construction team at Vung Ro returned to Cam Ranh Bay following completion of a 20' x 124' hootch/head and a 20' x 50' HECP/BOQ. Construction commenced of a 40' x 100' raised Butler building at NSF, CRB, and a 24' x 24' wood structure at Binh Ba Village was constructed as part of the continuing Civic Action program.


CBMU-302 is homeported and located at Naval Support Facility, Cam Ranh Bay, Republic of Vietnam. The Unit arrived on 20 September 1967 from U. S. Naval Construction Battalion Center, Port Hueneme, California. Initial strength was 160 officers and men. Major construction has included a 40' x 100' Admin building, a 40' x 100' Supply warehouse, a 40' x 100' Mechanics shop, a 40' x 100' Facilities maintenance shop a 40' x 100' raised PCF Overhaul structure, expansion and modernization of the EM Club, eight 50' x 128' ammo pad shelters, installation of sewer lines and spetic tank, stabilization of base roads and storage areas with soil cement, and installation of 440V power systems at the pier. Major maintenance projects have included antenna fields, roads and transportation equipment.





Acting as a support company for the other two CBMU-302 Companies, Headquarters Company quietly performs its vital tasks to supply, feed, clothe, medicate and administer the personnel of the Unit.

"H" Company consists of personnel from Operations, Supply, Disbursing, Admin/Personnel, Medical and Galley. Basically the Company is responsible for the military training, mustering, berthing and administrative control of the SEABEES assigned. Workday functions fall under the control of the appropriate Department heads.
