TASK ORGANIZATION: MCB ONE (Herein known as the Battalion)

1. SITUATION. In accordance with reference (a), the Battalion is undergoing a ~~military~~ technical and operational training period. As part of this training, the Battalion will conduct training in individual combat and military tactics at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina under the following conditions:

a. Enemy Forces. None

b. Friendly Forces. SERVLANT 21ST NCR

 MARCORBASE CAMLEJ MCB SEVENTY-ONE

2. MISSION. Pursuant to reference (a), the Battalion is to deploy to Camp Lejeune in conjunction with military training requirements, for the operational readiness of Naval Construction Battalions.

3. EXECUTION. When directed in February 1967, the Battalion will deploy for a period of approximately three weeks. While in transit and during the training period, the Battalion will maintain readiness conditions required by its assigned contingency designation.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS.

a. Standard operational procedures and logistics information set forth by reference (b), will be followed.

b. Leave will be administered in accordance with reference (c).

c. Movement reports will be made in accordance with reference (d).

d. Equipment assignments are made by Annex B. This equipment shall be received from MCB SEVENTY-ONE by an Advance Party of MCB ONE at Camp Lejeune not later than 27 January 1967.



ANNEX B
EQUIPMENT ASSIGNMENT

1. The USN Equipment authorized for this deployment is listed on the EAM listing which will be forwarded under separate cover.
2. Reference (e) sets forth the requirements for control and management reporting of the equipment assigned.
3. The USN Equipment required for this training is located at Camp Lejeune in the custody of the Commanding Officer, Mobile Construction Battalion SEVENTY-ONE. This equipment will be transferred to MCB ONE after a joint inspection has been held to ascertain the condition and status of the equipment. Upon completion of the field training at Camp Lejeune, the equipment will be returned to the Motor Transport Officer, whose telephone number is 7-3134 or 7-5736, utilizing the Form DD 1150 which the Motor Transport Officer will sign as accepting custody of the equipment. At time of transfer to the Motor Transport Officer, a complete Shop Repair Order (NAVDOKS 1948) will be submitted with each piece of equipment, showing parts required (manufacturer part number) and work necessary to place equipment in E-1 condition. A copy of the Shop Repair Orders will be forwarded to Code R-60 of the TWENTY-FIRST Naval Construction Regiment.
4. During the training deployment and while the equipment is being utilized by the Battalion, the Battalion will be responsible for all maintenance and minor repairs required and maintain the equipment in E-1 condition. Funds required for procurement of repair parts will be provided by the CBLANT Logistics Officer.
5. Equipment requiring major repairs will be turned in to the Motor Transport Officer who will effect such repairs as may be necessary.
6. In accordance with reference (e), the 512 report on all USN equipment will be completed and forwarded to the TWENTY-FIRST Naval Construction Regiment, Code R-60 within five (5) days after the return of the Battalion to CBC, Davisville.
7. The dispatchers Log, DD 1359, will be maintained on a daily basis and all logs will be submitted to the TWENTY-FIRST Naval Construction Regiment Equipment Officer upon completion of training at Camp Lejeune.

ANNEX C
PUBLIC AFFAIRS

1. MISSION. Collect and disseminate public affairs material that will illustrate the defensive, military posture and smartness of today's Seabees.

2. EXECUTION:

b. Extreme care must be exercised to ensure that public affairs releases confirm with the following:

(2) Do not contain any material which may reflect with discredit on the United States or any branch of the U. S. Armed Forces.

(3) Do not contain any material which tends to degrade or ridicule the customs or living conditions of the area where deployed.

c. News releases will be made only through the operational/area Commander.
