

OPERATION ORDER

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TASK ORGANIZATION: MCB FOUR

1. SITUATION: Peacetime deployment and employment of Naval Construction Battalions requires continuing rotation of units in the Atlantic and Pacific areas with emphasis on mobility and readiness. Accordingly, it is necessary to move MCB FOUR from U.S. Naval Construction Battalion Center Davisville, Rhode Island to U.S. Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina in January 1964 for military training under the following conditions:

a. Enemy Forces: NONE.

b. Friendly Forces:

c. Attachments: STAT 6-1

2. MISSION: Pursuant to reference (a), MCB FOUR is to deploy to CAMLEJ in conjunction with military training requirements for the operational readiness of Naval Construction Battalions in support of U.S. Fleet activities.

3. EXECUTION: When directed in January, MCB FOUR will depart from the CBCEN Davisville and will deploy to CAMLEJ for a period of approximately six weeks. During this time the following minimum readiness conditions will be maintained by the Battalion:

a. While in transit, be capable of being organizationally redeployed or dispersed immediately to emergency, contingency, or mobilization assignments.

b. While on deployment site, be capable of being organizationally redeployed within ten days notice.

During the deployment period MCB FOUR will take maximum advantage of available facilities in order to improve its operational preparedness through improvement of its materiel condition and prosecution of a vigorous training program in accordance with the training assignment of Annex A, including conducting continuing preparations for immediate redeployment.

Leave shall be administered in accordance with reference (b).

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS: The standard operational procedures set forth by reference (a), will be followed. Equipment assignments are made by Annex B.

5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL:

a. The Commanding Officer, U.S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion FOUR is hereby directed to report to the Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina in accordance with Article 1324, U.S. Navy Regulations.

b. Authority to deploy an advance party as necessary is hereby granted.

c. MCB FOUR is authorized direct liaison with Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina.

d. STAT 6-1 will report to the Commanding Officer, U.S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion FOUR for military control on signal.



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
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ANNEX B

1. The USN equipment authorized for deployment with MCB FOUR at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, is listed by the attached EAM listing.
2. Any item of USN equipment in the custody of MCB FOUR for this field training and not listed shall be reported. A verified copy of the list shall be returned to COMCBLANT (Attn: Code 42) promptly.
3. Reference (a) sets forth the responsibilities for custody, maintenance, and disposition of the equipment. Reference (b) sets forth the requirements for control and management reporting on the equipment monthly.
4. Upon completion of the field combat training at Camp Lejeune the equipment listed shall be promptly returned to the CBLANT Ready Line at the CBCEN Davisville. At that time, MCB FOUR will conduct a joint inspection in conjunction with the CBCEN (CED) to effect sub-custody transfer. Necessary forms for this transfer action will be furnished by this Headquarters (Code 42). A copy of the executed form on each piece of USN equipment must be returned for the files of COMCBLANT. At the time of sub-custody transfer a completed shop repair order (NAVDOCKS 1948) for each piece of equipment showing parts required (by manufacturers' part number) and work necessary to place it in E-1 condition will be submitted to CBCEN (CED), with an information copy attached to the COMCBLANT copy of the sub-custody transfer form.

b. Extreme care must be exercised to ensure that Public Information releases conform with the following:


(1) Do not make reference to any aspect of the deployment which may be considered as classified.
