1. COMMAND AND ORGANIZATION

On 3 December 1966, Naval Mobile Construction Battalion SEVENTY-FOUR was recommissioned under the command of CDR G. W. SCHLEY, CEC, USN. He was relieved by CDR J. A. D'EMIDIO, CEC, USN, on 2 October 1968. CDR James D. KIRKPATRICK, current Commanding Officer, took command of NMCB-74 on 27 August 1970.

On the first day of this history NMCB-74 was in Gulfport, Mississippi. Operational and Administrative control was with the TWENTIETH Naval Construction Regiment. During the Battalion's fourth consecutive deployment to Vietnam, Operational control was transferred from the TWENTIETH Naval Construction Regiment to the THIRTY-SECCND Naval Construction Regiment, THIRD Naval Construction Brigade and Commander Naval Construction Battalions, U. S. Pacific Fleet.

In October 1970, NMCB-74 was preparing for deployment to Bien Hoa, RVN to assume construction of ten major projects located throughout the Mekong Delta Region.

The main body consisting of 550 men began movement from Gulfport on 18 October 1970. The Battalion was located at CBC Bien Hoa, RVN on 23 October 1970.

During this deployment, Battalion units were detached to several areas:

Detail YANKEE, consisting of one officer and 75 enlisted men moved to Danang to provide horizontal assistance to the THIRTY-SECOND Naval Construction Regiment.

Detail NUTTEC, consisting of two enlisted men was located in Vung Tau. They provided support for the various Delta construction sites.

Long Phu was the site of Detail MOTEL. One officer and 67 enlisted men constructed an ACTOV base and dependent housing facilities.

One officer and 120 enlisted wen at Cho I oi made un Detail CHARLIE. The, as did Detail HOTEL, built up ACTOV base and dependent housing units.

The southern most detachment of NICB-74 was Detail GOLF at Nam Can. They completed construction of an Advanced Tactical Support Base and ACCOV and dependent housing facilities. Detail GOLF consisted of on officer and 35 enlisted men.

Detail PAPA was created at Binh Thuy to provide support for the various construction sites throughout the Delta. Thirteen men, one of which was an officer, made up the detail.

One officer and 13 enlisted pen located in Tuyen Nhon comprised Detail OCTOBER. They performed construction for canal bank erosion control.

Located at the Tan Son Mhut Air Base in Saigon, Detril MUM constructed headquarters for the THIRTY-GECOND Mayal Construction Regiment Headquarters. 20 enlisted men formed the detail. Fourteen enlisted men rehabilitated advisors facilities at Dong Tam, RVN. This was Detail ECHO.

Det il FOXTROT, comprised of one officer and 15 enlisted men, was located at Kien An. Their purpose was to repair battle da age to ACTOV facilitees.

At Mui Ta Kou was Det il KILO, consisting of one officer and 47 enlisted men. They constructed a Scabee base can for support of an ACTOV radar construction project. Also 5.2 miles of Route 341 were upgraded.

Detail JULIETT, made up of 36 enlisted men and one officer, was located at Mui Dinh. The detail made a beach landing via LST and constructed a base camp in support of a radar project similar to Detail KIIO's.

Four Senbee Tenns were deployed. Team 7405 to Ponane Island and 7406 to Truk Island in the United States Trust Territories Pacific Islands. The other two teams were sent to Vietnam; 7407 to Dinh Tuong and 7409 to Kien Phong. All four teams were made up of one officer and 12 enlisted men.

As of June 1971, 1103-74 had twenty-four (24) officers and 644 enlisted men.

2. OPERATIONS AND ACTIVITES

NEC3-74's fourth deployment to WM since recorrissioning, was to C3C, Bien Hoa, WM, as established by CO C3 AC O CD C331 A52 of 17 August 1970. (See deployment completion report, previously submitted)

a. Operational Statistics

The deployment completion report previously submitted, in reference to CCCCPAC OPOND Ser CB 31A52 of 17 August 1970 and COPCCPAC INST 5213.1E contains facts and digures concerning statistics during deployment.

b. Construction Assignments

MICE-74 was given a wide variety of projects while on the six onth deployment to CBC Bien Hoa, RVI. Post of these projects delt with or were in direct support of the ACTOV (Accelerated turnover to the Vietnamese) program.

Among the most outstanding of MCO-74's projects were the building of three ACTOV bases in the Pekong Delta. These bases were Cho Loi, Long Phu, and Num Can. TCO-74 also built two ACTOT radar stations at Dui Dinh and Nui Ta Kou.

Annex VII and VIII of the deployment completion report contains detailed information concerning these and the many other projects which WCB-74 completed. The deployment completion report also includes projects cost and labor statistics.

3. OUP LY UD LONGTICE

The P25A Organic Allowance was the basic supply and logistical support to the Battalion. Construction Battalion Center, Port Hueneme, as in previous deployments remained the mainstay of Battalion support in both remain parts and organic allowance areas.

Materials necessary for the construction projects were obtained from Long Binh Army Depot, Havel Support Activity Baigon and the Air Force, through Interservice Support Agreements.

On August 3, 1971, Murricane Celia struck at Corous Christi, Texas. Within twenty hours WC3-74 de doved 85 enlisted men and two officers to help with the clean-up. Whereency generators were inmediately installed and housing was restored over a period of weeks. At the peak of the clean-up operation, WC3-74 had 151 enlisted men and two officers on the job.
