4. Significant Events

23 JUN 69 NMCB ELEVEN/NMCB TEN BEEP completed.

28 JUN 69 CDR W. K. Hartell, Commanding Officer, U. S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion ELEVEN assumed command of Camp Haines.

28 JUL 69 CDR J. L. GODSEY, CEC, USN, relieved CDR. W. K. HARTELL, CEC, USN, as Commanding Officer of U. S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion ELEVEN at 1000, 28 July 1969 on board Camp Haines.

30 JUL 69 Bridge B-1-15A (YD610312), a 240' class 60 timber bridge, destroyed by fire.

07 AUG 69 At 0130 Detail Nancy personnel at LZ Nancy voluntarily assisted in extinguishing an ammunition fire. CMI TOGNAZZINI was killed and three other NMCB ELEVEN personnel were wounded in an ammunition explosion resulting from the fire.

07 AUG 69 NMCB ELEVEN Commanding Officer, Operations Officer, Battalion Master Chief and Color Guard participated in change of command ceremonies at THIRTY-SECOND Naval Construction Regiment.

09 AUG 69 NMCB ELEVEN with assistance from NMCB ONE completed reconstruction of Bridge B-1-15A.

19 AUG 69 0410-0630, Camp Haines in Condition Red. Camp Haines perimeter security killed one Viet Cong who had penetrated perimeter defenses.

24 AUG 69 LCDR GILMORE, CBPAC 20, and Major URBAN, 31NCR, on board for management information visit.

01 SEP 69 High winds and heavy rains experienced at Camp Haines due

21 SEP 69 Battalion celebrated its sixteenth birthday.

01 OCT 69 27.5 inches of rain fell on Camp Evans area causing heavy

clear debris piling up on upstream side of bridges.

17 OCT 69 At awards ceremony held on QL-1 near Quang Tri City, six
NMCB ELEVEN personnel were presented Vietnamese awards for
work performed during the construction of National Route
QL-1.

19 OCT 69 NMCB ELEVEN received official word that the Battalion will
be decommissioned on 20 December 1969.

20 OCT 69 RADM ENGER, COMNAVFACECOM on board Camp Haines for brief-
ing on Battalion operations.

30 OCT 69 Awards ceremony held at Song Bo Railroad Bridge. Sixteen
NMCB ELEVEN personnel were presented Vietnamese awards for
work performed during reconstruction of the Song Bo Rail-
road Bridge.

09 NOV 69 Village chiefs of Quang Dien district held a small banquet
for the crew that constructed secondary bridge SB #1 and
presented the members of the crew with gifts.


15 NOV 69 Awards ceremony held at Secondary Bridge #1. Col. Thanh
Province Chief, presented Vietnamese awards to twenty-two
NMCB ELEVEN personnel for work performed during construc-
tion of secondary bridges.

16 NOV 69 Admiral DILLON, Commodore WASHBURN, Captain FISHER, and
Captain LALOR on board Camp Haines for awards ceremony.
Admiral DILLON delivered a farewell address to NMCB ELEVEN
and presented awards to NMCB ELEVEN personnel.

18 NOV 69 Screaming Eagle Recruit Training School (SERTS) assumed
command of Camp Haines.

16 DEC 69 NMCB THREE Detail relieved NMCB ELEVEN Echo Detail at
Guam, M. I.
