- 1. In accordance with references (a) and (b), the Deployment Completion Report for U. S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion ONE HUNDRED TWENTY EIGHT's January to August 1969 deployment to Quang Tri, Republic of Vietnam is hereby submitted. The Operations Report for the period ending 20 August 1969 is incorporated within the Completion Report.
- 2. Employment Status. In accordance with COMCBPAC OPORD 31-68 U.S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-EIGHT was deployed to Camp Rhodes, Quang Tri, Republic of Vietnam from 12 January to 26 August 1969. The primary mission of the Battalion was construction in support of U.S. Free World Forces in Northern I Corps, while under the operational control of the Commander, THIRTY SECOND Naval Construction Regiment.

3. Unit Movements

a. The NMCB 128 Advance Party deployed to Vietnam on 27 December 1968 with 92 men under the leadership of Lieutenant Commander L. K. PETTY, CEC. USN, Operations Officer.

- b. The first of NMCB 128's Main Body departed Gulfport, Mississippi to Camp Rhodes on 15 January 1969. The movement of the entire Main Body was completed by 22 January 1969 utilizing four DC-8 aircraft.
- c. On l August 1969, NMCB 128's advance party under Lieutenant (Junior Grade) L. E. ALFREDSON, CEC, USN departed Camp Rhodes to return to the Construction Battalion Center, Gulfport, Mississippi to coordinate and organize the Battalion's Homeport Training Program.
- d. On 17 August 1969 NMCB 128's first flight departed to Gulfport. The movement of the entire Main Body was completed by 26 August 1969, utilizing seven Calli aircraft and 1 charter Bosing 707.
