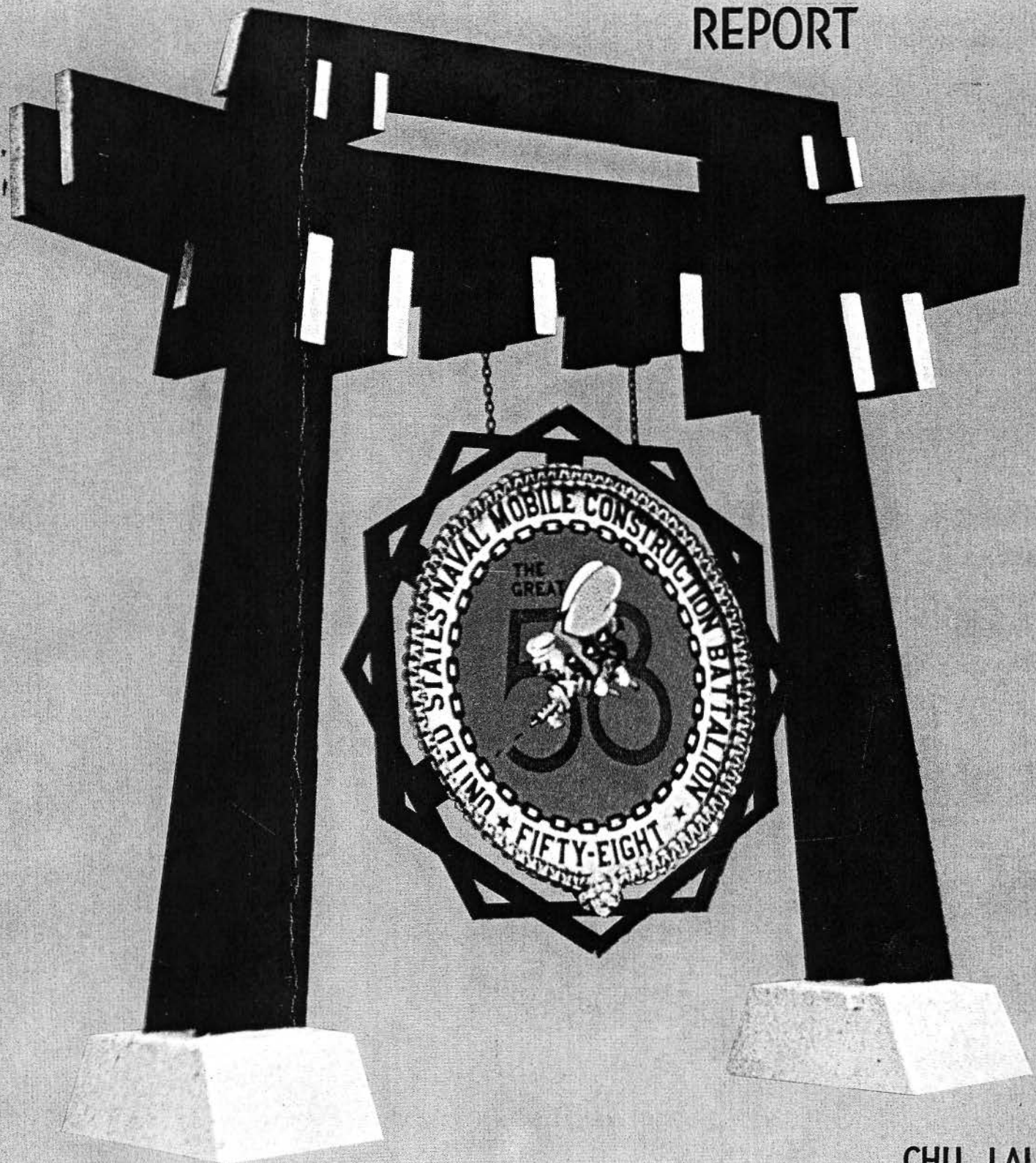

(10) LESSONS LEARNED:

1. The subject report as contained in enclosures (1) through (10) is submitted in accordance with reference (a).
2. UNIT LOCATION: In accordance with reference (b) U.S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion FIFTY-EIGHT was deployed to Camp Shields, Chu Lai, Republic of Viet Nam from February, 1969 through October, 1969.

3. UNIT MOVEMENTS:

19 January 1969	MCB-58's Advance Party, consisting of six (6) officers and ninety-four (94) enlisted men, arrived in Camp Shields, Chu Lai, from Davisville, Rhode Island.
3 February 1969	MCB-58's Commanding Officer, S-2 Officer, Officer in charge of the Quarry and the Enlisted Marine Advisor arrived in Camp Shields.
10 February 1969	The first main body passenger flight of one officer and ninety-two (92) enlisted men and the cargo flight arrived in Camp Shields.
14 February 1969	Three (3) main body flights, totaling six (6) officers and two hundred forty-nine (249) enlisted men, arrived in Camp Shields.
15 February 1969	Three (3) main body flights, totaling five (5) officers and two hundred thirty-four (234) enlisted men, arrived in Camp Shields.
10 March 1969	Detail Echo, consisting of eight (8) men, was established in connection with C. I. No. 8LYBTC185, Hospital Renovation, Quang Ngai.
29 March 1969	Detail Golf, ultimately consisting of one (1) officer and forty-six (46) enlisted men, was established in connection with C. I. No. 9LYSTA307, Duc Pho Airfield Repair, Duc Pho.
31 March 1969	Detail Foxtrot, consisting of seventeen (17) men was established in connection with C. I. No. 9LYLTM139, Song Tra Bong Bridge Repair, Binh Son.

9 April 1969 Detail Hotel, consisting of one (1) officer and thirty-five (35) enlisted men departed Chu Lai in connection with C. I. No. 9LYSTM299, Riverbank Clearing, at classified locations in the Delta Regions of South Viet Nam.

14 April 1969 Detail Echo, consisting of eight (8) men returned to Chu Lai upon completion of the Electrical Construction phase on C. I. No. 8LYBTC185, GVN/MOH Hospital Renovation, Quang Ngai.

6 May 1969 Seabee Team 5804, consisting of one (1) officer and twelve (12) enlisted men, deployed from the main body to Rach Gai City, Kien Giang Province, to perform construction and technical assistance in support of USAID projects.

20 May 1969 Detail Echo, consisting initially of five (5) men, was re-established to commence construction of the waterborne sewage system for C. I. No. 8LYBTC185, GVN/MOH Hospital Renovation, Quang Ngai City. First phase of this system will be the construction of a single stage oxidation pond.

26 May 1969 Detail Golf, consisting of one (1) officer and twenty-four (24) enlisted men, established in connection with C. I. No. 9LYSTA307, Duc Pho Airfield Repair, Duc Pho, returned to Camp Shields upon completion of the project.

15 June 1969 Detail Hotel, consisting of one (1) officer and twenty-four men, established in connection with C. I. No. 9LYSTM299, Riverbank Clearing at classified locations in the Delta Regions of South Viet Nam, returned to Camp Shields.

18 July 1969 Detail Juliet, consisting of sixteen men, established in connection with C. I. No. 900BNA016, Repair and soil-cementing of 1.2 kilometers of Route 535, was deployed to Landing Zone Baldy, near Thang Dong.

24 July 1969 Detail Foxtrot, consisting of four (4) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 9LYLTM139, Song Tra Bong Bridge Repair, returned to Camp Shields upon completion of the bridge. Detail Foxtrot dis-established this date.

3 August 1969 Detail Juliet, consisting of sixteen (16) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 953STA002, Repair and soil-cementing of 1.2 kilometers of Route 535, Landing Zone Baldy near Thang Dong, returned to Camp Shields upon completion of the roadwork. Detail Juliet dis-established this date.

10 August 1969 Detail KILO, consisting of five (5) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 953STA002, Special Forces Runway Repair, was deployed to Tra Bong.

17 August 1969 Detail LIMA, consisting of fifteen (15) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 953STA002, Special Forces Runway Repair, was deployed to Minh Long.

31 August 1969 Detail MIKE, consisting of twenty-five (25) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 000BTC020, POW Detention Center, was deployed to Tam Ky.

4 September 1969 Detail NOVEMBER, consisting of twenty (20) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 000BTC022, POW Detention Center, was deployed to Quang Ngai.

21 September 1969 NMCB-58's Advance Party, consisting of ninety-two (92) enlisted men and four (4) officers, was deployed to CONUS.

1 October 1969 Detail QUEBEC, consisting of eighty-six (86) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 8LYQTM194, Cam Lo Rock Crusher, returned to Camp Shields upon turnover of facilities to MCB-74. Detail QUEBEC disestablished this date.

1 October 1969 Detail LIMA, consisting of fifteen (15) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 953STA002, Special Forces Runway Repair, returned to Camp Shields upon turnover of facilities to MCB-7. Detail LIMA disestablished this date.

1 October 1969 Detail KILO, consisting of eight (8) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 953STA002, Special Forces Runway Repair, returned to Camp Shields upon completion of runway repair. Detail KILO disestablished this date.

6 October 1969 Detail NOVEMBER, consisting of twenty (20) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 000BTC022, POW Detention Center, Quang Ngai, returned to Camp Shields upon turnover of facilities to MCB-7. Detail NOVEMBER disestablished this date.

7 October 1969 Detail MIKE, consisting of twenty-five (25) men, established in connection with C. I. No. 000BTC020, POW Detention Center, Tam Ky, returned to Camp Shields upon completion of facilities. Detail MIKE disestablished this date.

8 October 1969 Seabee Teams 5803 and 5804 returned to Camp Shields upon turnover of facilities to Seabee Teams 7403 and 0605 respectively.

9-13 October 1969 Main body flights of the GREAT 58 depart for redeployment to CONUS.

25 July 1969 CDR C. J. MATHEWS, CEC, USN, and ENS T. SHELLEY, CEC, USNR, prospective Seabee Team OIC departed on tour of Seabee Teams 5803 at Chau Phu City and 5804 at Rach Gia.

29 July 1969 Holiday and party for members of NMCB-58 who are "plankowners" of the recommissioned battalion in honor of the faithful service and sustained superior performance of these 24 men. Twenty plank owners are presently serving with NMCB-58 in the Republic of Viet Nam.

8-11 August 1969 CAPT J. E. POWELL, CEC, USN, COM30NCR visited Camp Shields in connection with predeployment visit by NMCB-7.

9-13 August 1969 Predeployment visit by members of relieving battalion.

10 August 1969 CDR C. J. MATHEWS CEC, USN, Commanding Officer NMCB-58 presented graduation certificates to eight (8) ARVN Engineer trainees at celebrations honoring the anniversary of the 104th ARVN Engineer Battalion.

10 August 1969 CAPT J.E. WASHBURN, CEC, USN, COM32NCR visited Cam Lo Quarry site to observe progress of the quarrying and crusher operation.

15 August 1969 RADM J. G. DILLON, CEC, USN, COM3NCB AND CAPT J. E. WASHBURN, CEC, USN, COM32NCR visited Cam Lo Quarry site to observe progress and discuss Cam Lo closedown in late September or early October.

23-25 August 1969 CDR C. J. MATHEWS, CEC, USN, Commanding Officer, and LCDR R. E. STEIDLE, SC, USN, Supply Officer, NMCB-58 visited DaNang and Cam Lo to discuss procedures and actions for closedown of Cam Lo site.

5-6 September 1969 CAPT J. E. POWELL, CEC USN, COM30NCR visited Camp Shields for discussions on current project progress and newly assigned projects.

11 September 1969 Awards Banquet held in honor of champions of the three competitive sports played during the deployment's recreation season; Basketball - Headquarters Company; Softball - Headquarters Company; Volleyball - Wardroom.

14 September 1969 Battalion quarters held at which graduation certificates were presented to seven ARVN Engineers (mechanic trainees) for successfully passing the course of instruction prepared by MCB-58. Highlight of the ceremony was an exchange of command plaques between CDR C. J. MATHEWS, Commanding Officer of MCB-58, and MAJ NGUYEN HOANG ANH, Commanding Officer of the 104th ARVN Engineer Battalion.

18 September 1969 RADM J. G. DILLON, CEC, USN, COM3NCB and CAPT J. E. POWELL, CEC, USN, COM30NCR visited Camp Shields in connection with progress on construction at Chu Lai, Tam Ky and Quang Ngai, visiting each site.

20 September 1969 RADM J. G. DILLON, CEC, USN, COM3NCB visited Camp Shields to address farewell remarks to the last in-country formation of the entire battalion.

21 September 1969 NMCB-7's Advance Party consisting of 98 enlisted men and four (4) officers arrived at Camp Shields.

NMCB-58's Advance Party consisting of 92 enlisted men and four (4) officers departed Camp Shields for return to CONUS.

28 September 1969 Start of "BEEP" - Battalion Equipment Evaluation Program - turnover of construction equipment and vehicles from MCB-58 to MCB-7.

1 October 1969 Ceremonies marking completion and opening of Civic Action provided school facilities on Cu Lao Re Island.

10 October 1969 Turnover briefing held at Camp Shields. Participating in the briefing were CDR J. C. RICKELS, CO, MCB-7; CDR C. J. MATHEWS, CO, MCB-58, LCDR, E. UNDERHILL, S4, MCB-7; LCDR R. E. STEIDLE, S4, MCB-58, LCDR B. C. JACKSON, S3, MCB-7, LCDR D. C. STURMER, S3, MCB-58.

10 October 1969 Change of Command ceremonies were held with CDR J. C. RICKELS, CEC, USN, CO, MCB-7 relieving CDR C. J. MATHEWS, CEC, USN, CO, MCB-58.

5. MILITARY ACTION:

23 February 1969 Two Condition Yellow Alerts were sounded early Sunday morning. An approximate total of sixty-six (66) rockets and an unknown number of mortars impacted in the Chu Lai Enclave. No rounds impacted within Camp Shields.

28 February 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0710 when two (2) rockets impacted within the Chu Lai Enclave.

4 March 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0630 when eight (8) rockets impacted within the Rosemary Point area.

7 March 1969 Cam Lo. Rock dump struck land mine on the Quarry haulroad at 1600. Driver suffered a broken eardrum and was MedEvaced, returned for duty the following day. Truck suffered minor damage to left front area.

19 March 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0130 when approximately eighteen (18) rounds of mortar fire impacted on the West side of the Chu Lai Enclave.

19 March 1969 Cam Lo. Enemy charge was detonated approximately twenty-five (25) meters from road at 1000. One Seabee suffered torn cartilage in one knee.

19 March 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 1030 when two (2) rockets impacted in the ocean immediately off Camp Shields.

19 March 1969 Cam Lo. Three (3) rounds of sniper fire received at 1100. Fire returned and 81mm called in with negative results.

20 March 1969 Cam Lo. Three (3) rounds of sniper fire received at 1045. Fire returned with negative results.

20 March 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 2130 when four (4) rockets impacted on the beach of the camp adjacent to Camp Shields.

21 March 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0645 when six (6) rockets impacted on the airfield setting off numerous secondary explosions.

23 March 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0530 when three (3) rockets impacted within the enclave. Two (2) rounds impacted in the ocean beyond a camp adjacent to Camp Shields.

24 March 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0645 when one (1) round impacted within the southern boundry of the enclave.

24 March 1969 Cam Lo. Gun position received six (6) rounds of sniper fire at 1650. Fire returned with negative results.

12 May 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0305 when an undetermined number of rockets impacted in the Rosemary Point area and approximately four (4) rocket rounds impacted in the 6th Battalion 56th Artillery area immediately to the south of Camp Shields.

12 May 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 1010 when two (2) rockets impacted in the 2nd Surgical Hospital area and an undetermined number of rockets impacted near the MAG-13 flight line and Americal Division Headquarters area.

17 May 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0627 when approximately eight (8) suspected mortar rounds impacted west of the MAG-12 flight line.

20 May 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0238 when an undetermined number of rocket impacts were reported in the Americal Division Headquarters area.

7 June 1969 SW3 J. S. STAFF was killed and SW3 G. L. THOMPSON was seriously wounded when they detonated a booby trap. Petty officers STAFF and THOMPSON were working in connection with land clearing operations as part of Detail HOTEL.

8 June 1969 The Binh Son MACV Compound was probed by sappers with satchel charges under supporting mortar fire at 0145. Detail FOXTROT supported the repulsion of the enemy assault. There were no casualties.

8 June 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0549 when approximately five (5) rockets impacted in the Rosemary Point area.

11 June 1969 Cam Lo. Detail QUEBEC provided aid and assistance to the crew and wounded of a Marine CH-46 Medevac helicopter which had crash-landed at the rock crusher site.

14 June 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 1110 when an undetermined number of rockets impacted near the MAG-12 flight line. Nearby NMCB-58 crews received no casualties.

20 June 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 1615 when two (2) mortar rounds impacted near the MAG-12 flight line. Nearby NMCB-58 crews received no casualties.

21 June 1969 Condition Yellow was set at 0657 when two (2) rockets impacted in the 6th Battalion 56th Artillery area immediately to the south of Camp Shields.

21 June 1969 Detail QUEBEC at Cam Lo Crusher Site claimed at least one (1) enemy KIA when morning sweep teams of the riverside quarry came upon the body of an enemy soldier who had tripped a booby-trap set at a security position by QUEBEC's security force upon departing the area the previous evening. By all appearances the soldier had been attempting to place a booby-trap of his own at the position. The local Vietnamese citizenry reported that others had been killed, but had been carried off during the night.

12 August 1969 Condition II was set at 0150 when an undetermined number of rockets and mortars impacted in the 198th Light Infantry Brigade area.

12 August 1969 Condition II was set at 0545 when six (6) rockets impacted nearby, at least one (1) in Camp Shields. BUCN R. A. O'CONNER was killed and nine (9) others wounded as a result of an attack that produced a direct 122mm rocket impact on Hut No. 511.

14 August 1969 Condition II was set at 0855 when a rocket impacted in the 723rd POL Dump area, and resulted in a major petroleum fire which destroyed a million gallons of various petroleum products.
