Construction Battalion Detachment 1802 and 1803

In August 1951, the Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) approved a request of CINCPACFLT to organize and deploy two Seabee teams to aid in on-site development surveys and the preparation of detailed base development plans in the Pacific. These teams were designated Construction Battalion Detachment (CBD) 1802 and 1803.

CBD 1802 and CBD 1803 were established as an interim measure and the personnel for these units were drawn from other Construction Battalion units in the Pacific. There were no personnel allowances officially established for these units.

These units carried on survey and development projects at Guam, Cubi Point, Subic Bay, Korea, Japan, Okinawa, Arakabsen, Tinian, Falalop, Ulithi, Angaur, and Koror.

In July 1952, the CNO proposed that CBD 1802 and CBD 1803 be disestablished and that a personnel allowance be established for the 10th Naval Construction Brigade which was located at Pearl Harbor. This permitted CINCPACFLT to establish Detachments Able and Baker to carry on the former duties of CBD 1802 and 1803. It provided for ease of handling of administrative matters since the detachments would be located with the 10th Brigade at Pearl Harbor.
