U.S. Naval Construction Battalion 16

U.S. Naval Construction Battalion 16 was established on 2 August 1942 at Camp Allen, Norfolk, Virginia, with Lieutenant Commander Leonard Miscall, CEC, USNR, as officer in charge. The next day the battalion moved to the adjoining Camp Bradford and underwent an intensive course of advanced military training.

On 27 August 1942, the 16th Seabees departed from Camp Bradford and arrived at the Advance Base Depot, Port Hueneme, California, on 1 September. At Port Hueneme the battalion continued its advance military and combat training under the guidance of U.S. Marines, and the battalion was outfitted for overseas duty.

The battalion departed from Port Hueneme during the morning of 30 September 1942 and went to San Diego by rail. Later that same day the battalion sailed from San Diego for overseas duty.

The overseas history of the 16th Battalion is divided into three phases. The first phase covers the period from 4 October 1942 to 14 August 1943, when the battalion was stationed at Pearl Harbor, Oshu, Hawaiian Islands. The second phase covers the period from 14 August 1943 to 15 February 1944. During this phase the battalion constructed two air bases in the Ellice Island Group and furnished selected specialists for work at Tarawa, Makin, and Apemana. The third phase covers the period from 15 February 1944 to 2 May 1945, during which time the battalion again served at Pearl Harbor.

At the time of the 16th Battalion's first arrival at Pearl Harbor on 4 October 1942, only small units of the 5th and 10th Construction Battalions were stationed there. No other Seabee units were in the Hawaiian Islands. Navy construction work was being done by Contractors, Pacific Naval Air Bases under the direction of the Fourteenth Naval District Public Works Office. Some of these contractor projects were turned over to Battalion 16 for completion.

Among the many tasks accomplished by the battalion were the construction of roads, camps, public works buildings and projects, barracks, offices and headquarters structures, pipelines, and warehouses, and the development of the Makalapa area below the headquarters of the Commander in Chief, Pacific.

One of the outstanding accomplishments of the 16th Seabees occurred during the period from November 1942 to April 1943. From the battalion, about 120 shipfitters, riggers, and electricians were selected to work aboard the U.S.S. West Virginia, a casualty of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, which had recently been raised from the bottom of the sea. The men did general work, wiring, ventilation work, welding, enlarging of steam lines, engine room repairing, insulation work, boiler lining, rigging, and schieving watertight integrity.

Because of the 16th Seabee efforts, the battleship was made seaworthy three months ahead of schedule. This speed and the noteworthy calibre of the workmanship generated commendations for the battalion from Admiral Chester Nimitz, Commander in Chief Pacific; Vice Admiral Robert Ghormley, Commandant of the Fourteenth Naval District; and Vice Admiral William Calhoun, Commander of the Service Force, Pacific Fleet.

On 14 August 1943, Naval Construction Battalion 16 left Pearl Harbor and proceeded in three echelons to Funafuti in the Ellice Islands and by 24 August the three echelons had all arrived. While staging at Funafuti, the battalion was subjected to severe Japanese bombing attacks, but the Seabees suffered no casualties.

The battalion was then divided into two sections. One section went to Nanomea and the other section went to Nukufetau, two other islands in the Ellice Group. On both islands the 16th Seabees then constructed complete air bases and facilities for the use of the U.S. Marines and the U.S. Army Air Forces in the Marshall and Gilbert Islands campaign.

In addition, detachments of the 16th Battalion moved forward and participated in the Tarawa, Makin, and Apemana invasions. At these places the Seabees operated equipment and built and maintained fuel tank farms.

As the campaign in the Marshall and Gilbert Islands progressed, the Marine and Air Force units moved further along the road to Tokyo and began using more advanced bases. Consequently, Naval Construction Battalion 16 was ordered back to Pearl Harbor. On 6 February 1944, all elements of the battalion were reunited at Funafuti and sailed toward new challenges in construction.

The battalion arrived back at Pearl Harbor on 15 February 1944. Sufficient facilities for housing the 16th Seabees were unavailable, so the battalion rushed the construction of housing, latrines, showers, and a galley. This work was completed by 10 March and the 16th then took up the task of constructing two camps for other Seabee units.

Then the 16th Battalion undertook the construction of the mammoth Waiawa Seabee Camp. This task was followed by lumber sorting and grading, a material and parts survey for the Second Naval Construction Brigade, salvaging of electric cable at the Naval Air Station, recaulking two miles of 8-inch water line, and building 22 B.O.Q. quonset huts at the Aiea Naval Receiving Barracks.

For the following year the 16th Seabees continued building additional barracks, camps, galleys, messhalls, and administration buildings. Gradually the complement of the battalion was dwindling as men were reassigned to other Naval construction units. Greatly reduced in strength, Naval Construction Battalion 16 was disestablished at Pearl Harbor on 2 May 1945.
