25TH BATTALION

Activation on Sept. 13, 1942 at Norfolk launched the 25th Battalion on a long history spotlighted by nearly three years' overseas duty. The outfit went to Hue-neme, then to Camp Elliott at San Diego on Oct. 31. After 250 men were transferred to NCB Replacement Group, FMF-TC, the remainder of the 25th was attached to the Third Marine Division, FMF, and the unit designated as Third Battalion, 19th Marines, Third Marine Division. Remaining companies were renamed as Headquarters, G. H, and I. On Jan. 1, 1943, Co. G and 1/5th of Headquarters transferred to Ninth Marines (Reinforced), Third Marine Division. Co. H. and 1/5th of Headquarters transferred to 21st Marines (Reinforced), Third Marine Division, on Jan. 25. Co. I and 1/5th of Headquarters were attached to Headquarters, Amphibious Corps FMF, for administrative purposes on Feb. 15. The G and H detachments reached Auckland, New Zealand in Feb., 1943, and the Co. I

detachment reached Auckland May 28 after a two months' stay at Pago Pago, Tutuila, American Samoa. In June, G. H and I were detached from the Marines and returned to Battalion administration. The 25th, now composed of a headquarters and three construction companies, moved to Guadalcanal in three echelons, the last group arriving at the 'Canal on Aug. 1, It sent 386 men and 15 officers into the early Bougainville invasion, the group landing under enemy fire Nov. 1. From Nov. 6 to Nov. 28, an additional 317 men and six officers landed at Bougainville The forward echelons returned to Guadalcanal by Jan. 7, 1944. The Battahon was redesignated as the 25th NCE on April 11 and released from adminis-trative control of Third Marine Division; then it was attached to Third Amphibious Corps, FMF, for administrative purposes and to the Third Marine Division for operational purposes. The forward echelon of 621 men and 23 officers landed on Guam under enemy fire on July 21, and by Sept. 20, all personnel had moved to Guam. The 25th was released from the Marines and attached to the Fifth NC Brigade Aug. 17. At war's close, the 25th was still operating on that island.

25th NCB

September 19h2, Camp Bradford, Virginia. Inactivated November 19h5.

Tours included Auckland, Pago Pago, Tutuila, Guadacanal, Bougainville, and Guam.

The 25th NCB was attached to Marine Corps and the name of the Battalion was 3rd Battalion, Mineteenth Marines, 3rd Marine Division, Flaet Marine Force. From 1942 to August 1945 the Battalion was part of the Marine Corps which had both operational and administrative control. In August 1945 the Battalion was detached from the Marines and again became the 25th NCB operating under the control of the 27th NCB Regiment of the 5th NCBrigade.

The Bougainville operation was under the operational control of General Douglas MacArthur of the U.S. Army, so the Battalion has the unique distinction of having served under the Army, Navy and Marine Corps.

One group of the Battalion went to Vella and established a sawmill for the 77th NCB despite combat conditions and frequent air raids.

On Bougainville they landed with the 3rd Marine Division in the first assault. They built and dedicated a bridge for one of the men killed while working on a road to the front lines, 6 men were wounded and Chief Eddie Carruthers was killed. After 45 days the road was completed and the Battalion went to Guadacanal.

July 21, 1944 landed on Guam with the Marines. Japs only fifty feet away, the mortar fire from Jap guns was constant, snipers a constant threat. After many days and after a 12 hour backbreaking day, the men of the Battalion were shifted into the hills to man a second line of defense as the Japs threatened to break through.

As the Marines moved forward the Battalion worked on the roads to move the equipment. Cat operators accompanied the Marines inland and cleared paths for tanks and other weapons. The ship bringing the Battalions gear was 60 days behind schedule and the men had to sleep in forholes during the heavy rainy season. They boasted of having the most elaborate forhole shelters of the Facific War.

19 officers and men were awarded the Bronze Star for their achievemenets during this operation. Some received the Purple Heart.

They moved 63,000,000 shovels of dirt and coral, enough to fill a ditch 2 feet wide, 2 feet deep and over 500 miles long.

Dear Mr. Sheppard:

In reply to your letter of 18 February 1964, Mrs. Katherine Zimmerman, Bureau Historian, has developed the following chronological history of 25th Special Naval Construction Battalion during World War II.

The 25th SNCB was commissioned 25 February 1944 at the Maval Construction Training Center, Camp Peary, Williamsburg, Va., and departed Feary on 4 March that year. The cutfit arrived at Port Hueneme, Calif., on 9 March and departed there for overseas duty on 26 April 1944.

The 25th SNCB arrived at Milne Bay, New Guines on 19 May 1944, after a brief stop at Noumea, New Caledonia. By the time the war ended, the 25th SNCB had served 15 consecutive months at Gamadodo, Milne Bay.

Following is a table showing dates that Officers in Charge and Executive Officers served the 25th SNCB:


