# History of the Battalion

The Sixty-Eighth Naval Construction Battalion was officially commissioned at Camp Bradford, Virginia, on January 10, 1943, when the Colors were presented to Lieutenant Commander James Ruderman, then officer-in-charge.

The battalion was transferred to Camp Peary, Magruder, Virginia, January 12, 1943, and quartered in Area A-2. The next thirty days were spent in extensive advanced military training as well as practical construction training on Public Works, area construction projects and upkeep.

Mid-month in February, most of the personnel of the Sixty-Eighth were detached and transferred to other units.

Shortly after the first of March, new personnel was assigned to the Sixty-Eighth, and re-organization took place in Area B-7 of Camp Peary. On March 19th, we bid adieu to the "garden spot of Virginia", and entrained for Camp Endicott, Davisville, Rhode Island, arriving there March 20th.

Most of us enjoyed our stay at Camp Endicott even though the routine there was one of unrelenting training. While the battalion was there, Commander L. W. Robertson assumed command, and shortly thereafter most of us were given our embarkation leave.

On May 12th, still "saddle-worn" from our long train rides while on leave, we entrained for an "unknown" destination which turned out to be Camp Parks, California. At Parks, we were again introduced to close order drill, judo, bayonet tactics and cross-

country running; all culminating in a long hike to Mt. Diablo and a four day stay there on field rations. There was nothing appealing about the California climate during that trek.

In the last week of May the battalion was again split up, fifty percent of the personnel being detached and assigned to another unit. They were replaced by a draft of men direct from Camp Peary. Shortly afterwards, the battalion moved to Camp Rousseau, Port Hueneme, California, to outfit for our tour of foreign duty.

July 7th saw us on the move again, and for (censored) days, we were literally "at sea". On July 29th we reached our destination, the land of williwaws, snow, rocks and rain. What a place! An island in the Aleutians with little to recommend it except the pleasant absence of bugs — even the latter are wiser than to habitate such shores.

In April, 1944, Commander L. W. Robertson was detached and Lieutenant Commander W. B. Cunningham assumed command as officer-in-charge; Lieutenant A. V. Blankenship became executive officer.

To date, the 68th has served a little better than one year overseas at this base, doing its job as quietly and efficiently as possible. No headlines have blazed forth extolling the accomplishments of the 68th, but we are not jealous of public acclaim. What we have done and will do here is important, and we may well be proud of our record. Increasingly often we fondly dream of "Stateside" pleasures, but until such dreams become reality, we shall continue to strive to uphold the traditions of the service in every way.
