

1922 MARCH 20 The fuel ship USS Jupiter is recommissioned as USS Langley (CV 1), the Navy's first aircraft carrier.



1962 OCTOBER The U.S. establishes a quarantine of Cuba in response to the Soviet deployment of missiles to the island.





1942 JUNE 4-7

The Battle of Midway is a turning point in World War II. The decisive American victory costs Japan four aircraft carriers and its strategic advantage, allowing the allies to go on the offensive.

1965 MARCH 11 During the Vietnam War, Task Force 115 stands up, conducting operations under the code name Market Time using fast, shallow-draft Swift boats.





1944 OCTOBER 23-2 The largest naval battle of the modern age, the Battle of Leyte Gulf begins. It ends Japan's capacity to fight as an organized force.



In Z-Gram 66, CNO Adm. Elmo Zumwalt directs immediate action to combat "significant discrimination in the Navy." He ends the Z-gram saying, "There is no black Navy, no white Navy—just one Navy—the United States Navy."





1950 SEPTEMBER 15 Troops are deployed ashore in the Korean War's Inchon landing, fracturing the North Korean war machine.



1988 APRIL 18 Navy ships and Navy and Marine aircraft strike Iranian oil platforms in Operation Praying Mantis in retaliation for the mining of USS Samuel B. Roberts (FFG 58).



1954 SEPTEMBER 30

The world's first nuclearpowered submarine, USS Nautilus (SSN 571), is commissioned at Groton, Conn.



1991 Operation Desert Sto begins.
