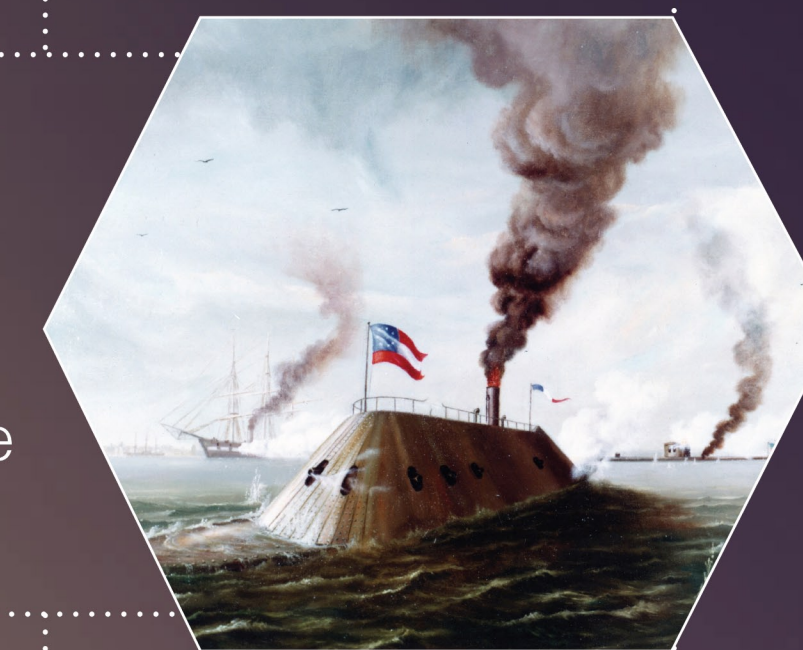

Authorized by the Continental Congress, the United States Navy is born.



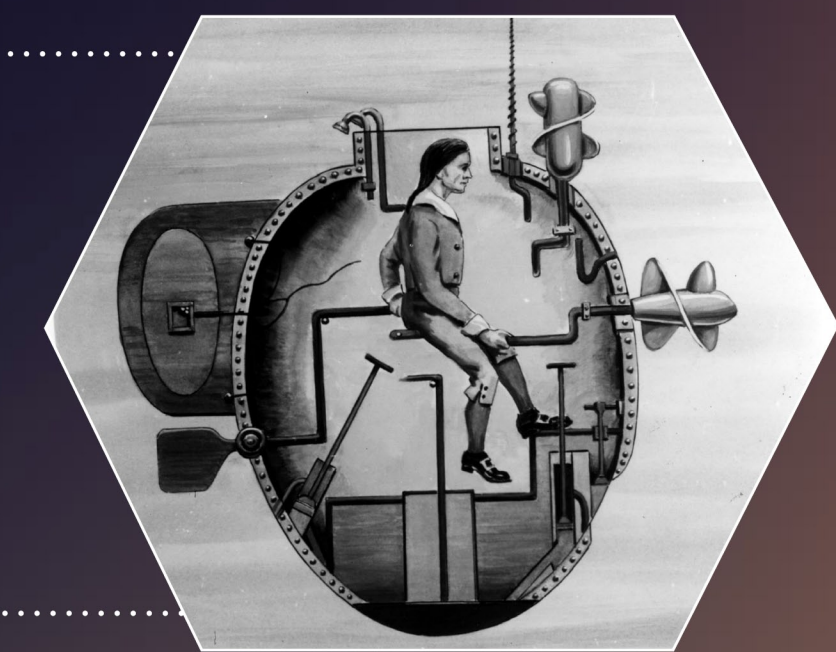

Turtle, the first combat submarine, attacks HMS Eagle in New York Harbor.

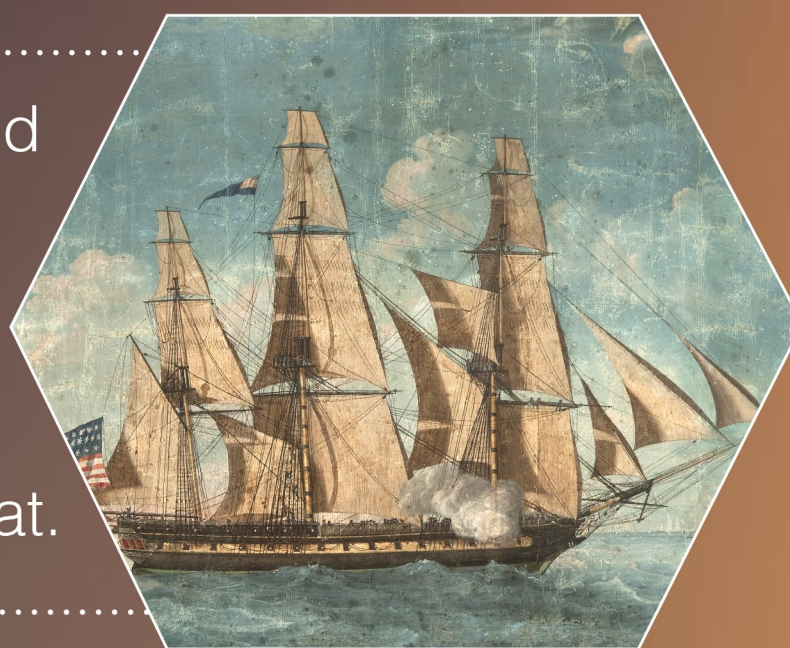


In the Battle of Manila Bay during the Spanish-American War, America's Navy liquidates the Spanish fleet and installations in the harbor without the loss of a single American life.

USS Constitution is launched and christened in Boston, Mass. Undeclared in battle and still in service today, she is the world's oldest commissioned warship afloat.

The U.S. victory at the Battle of Lake Champlain during the War of 1812 ends the war's final British invasion.



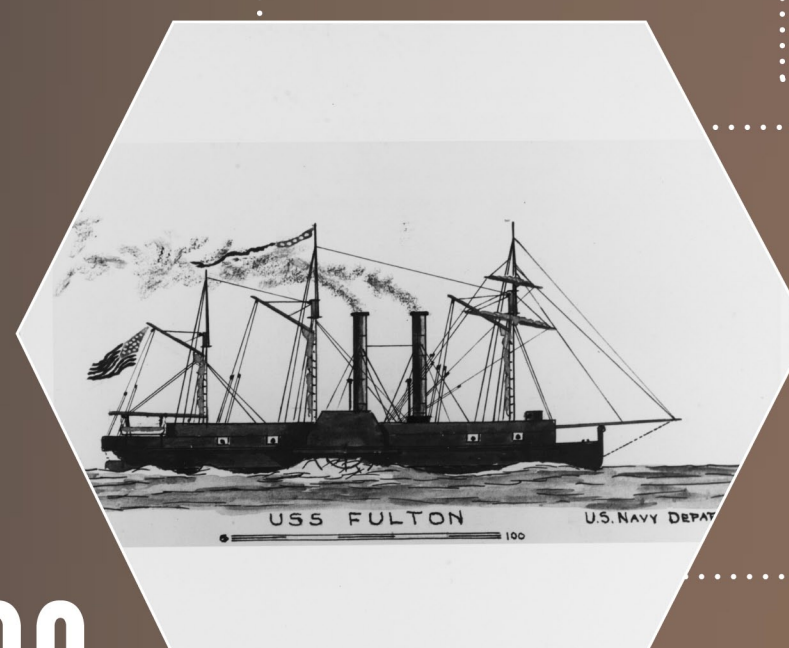
