USS New York (BB 34)

New York was the lead ship of a twoship class of 27,000-ton battleships. She was built at the New York Navy Yard and commissioned April 1914.

Grace M. Hopper Rear Admiral, USN

Rear Adm. Grace Hopper was a pioneer in the field of computer science. She worked as a programmer for the Harvard Mark I computer in the final years of WWII and helped develop COBOL—a standardized computer language. At the time of her retirement, at 79 years of age, she was the oldest commissioned officer in the U.S. Navy.



Theodore Roosevelt President

At the time, Theodore Roosevelt, not quite 43, became the youngest president in the nation's history. Before he was president, Roosevelt was Assistant Secretary of the Navy. As president, Roosevelt sent the Great White Fleet on a goodwill tour of the world.



Alfred T. Mahan Admiral, USN

Alfred T. Mahan was appointed President of the Naval War College in 1886. From 1884 until his death in 1914, Adm. Mahan studied and wrote on Naval historical and biographical subjects. His works have had tremendous influence all over the world, especially those directly concerning seapower, and have been translated into many different languages.

The Dutch settled New York in 1624. The State was then conquered by the English in 1664 and then named in honor of the Duke of York



Hunter College, Bronx, New York, was the basic training center for Navy and Coast Guard women during WWII.



Brooklyn Navy Yard - in 1801 President John Adams authorized the establishment of the first five naval shipyards including Brooklyn.
