



# THE NAVAL HISTORY OF COLORADO

## **USS Colorado (BB 45)**

Named after the state of Colorado, she was the lead ship of the Colorado class of battleships and the third naval ship named for the 38th state. Before sailing west to participate in WWII, Colorado conducted defensive patrols off California. During the war, she supported landings and provided pre-invasion bombardment for major engagements from Tarawa to Okinawa. For her service during WWII, Colorado was awarded seven battle stars.



At least 32 ships have been named after the state of Colorado, its cities, places, and people. A few of those include:




## John Kerry, Secretary of State

Born in Aurora, Colo. Dec. 11, 1943, Kerry began his naval career at Officer Candidate School, U.S. Naval Training Center, Newport, R.I. on Aug. 19, 1966. He served onboard the USS Gridley (DLG 21) on a Western Pacific deployment in 1968 in support of the Vietnam War. He would later serve as officer-in-charge of a Swift boat, completing multiple tours in Vietnam. For his service, Kerry was awarded the Silver Star, Bronze Star and three Purple Heart medals.



# Arleigh Burke, Admiral

Born in Boulder, Colo. Oct. 19, 1901, Burke graduated from the Naval Academy in 1923. Between tours of duty in various battleships and destroyers, he earned the nickname "31-Knot Burke" for pushing Destroyer Squadron (DESRON) 23 to 31 knots. DESRON 23 participated in more than 20 engagements; destroyed a Japanese cruiser, nine destroyers, and a submarine; and accounted for some 30 enemy aircraft. After a number of commands post-World War II, he was appointed as the Chief of Naval Operations by President Dwight D. Eisenhower and served in the position for an unprecedented six years. The U.S. Navy's Arleigh Burke class of destroyers is named in his honor.



# Kati Garner, U.S. Navy's first female SCUBA diver

Born in Colorado Springs, Colo. May 9, 1953, Garner joined the U.S. Navy in 1972 at the age of 19. She was working in the Personnel Office at Recruit Training Center, San Diego, when she learned the Navy was seeking female divers. Finding a trainer and mentor, Chief Signalman Bob Diecks, she trained for four weeks before attending dive school. She graduated on Nov. 30, 1973, qualifying as the U.S. Navy's first female SCUBA diver.



### Did You Know...?

USS Pueblo (AGER 2) was captured by North Korea in 1968 in the state's territorial waters off Wonson. The ship's status is still listed as "active, in commission."
