1. In accordance with references (a) and (b), the action report for the period 6 through 21 September is hereby submitted.

Part I - Composition of own Forces and Missions:

U.S.S. PHILIPPINE SEA (CV-47) with CTF 77 and CTG 77.4 (ComCarDivONE) embarked sortied from SASEBO HARBOR at 0630I on 11 September 1950 in company with other units of Task Force 77. This ship was operating in accordance with ComSEVENTHFlt Operation Plan 9-50 and ComCarDivONE Operation Order No. 1-50. The mission of this task force was to maintain air supremacy in the objective area, to isolate the objective area, and to provide air cover and support for the Attack Force in order to assist in the amphibious assault and capture of the Inchon-Seoul area.

Part II - Chronological Order of Events:

The ship sortied from SASEBO HARBOR at 0630I, 11 September 1950 for the east coast of Korea. The three days, 12, 13, and 14 September, were spent in conducting attacks on defenses in the Inchon area, and in providing air cover and gunfire spotting aircraft for Task Force 90 which was conducting pre-D day shore bombardment. During the period 15 through 21 September aircraft from this ship performed the following tasks: (a) close and deep support for ground forces, (b) TARCAP, (c) night heckler and intruders,

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(d) Naval gunfire spotting aircraft, (e) armed reconnaissance north of 38°N, (f) Photo reconnaissance, (g) CAP and ASP for own forces. Throughout the operation, morning and afternoon sweeps were made of all enemy airfields within a radius of 150 miles.

U.S.S. BOXER (CV-21) joined Task Force 77 on 15 September. This ship replenished on 16 and 19 September; on these days, combat air operations were not conducted from this ship.

(1) Effectiveness of close and deep support throughout the period was restricted due to the lack of up-to-date information on friendly front line positions and bomb lines.

(2) Dumping targets were not established. Close support flights were occasionally kept orbiting until 10 minutes prior to
