





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C. (C) REMARKS

(1)THE BLACK STALLIONS HIT THE DECK RUNNING IN CY 84, JUST TWO WEEKS AFTER ACHIEVING INITIAL OPERATING CAPABILITY. OPERATING FROM A FORWARD AIRHEAD AT LARNACA, CY, HC-4 OUICKLY ESTABLISHED THE CH-53E AS THE PRIME MOVER FOR AIR DELIVERED CARGO TO SIXTH FLEET UNITS, BY SIMULTANEOUSLY SUPPORTING TWO CVBG'S, AN AMPHIBIOUS READY GROUP, THE NEW JERSEY SURFACE ACTION GROUP, AND CTF-62 SHORE BASED IN BEIRUT. IN THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF OPERATIONS, THE LARNACA DETACHMENT SUSTAINED AN AIRCRAFT UNTILIZATION RATE OF 175 PERCENT ABOVE THAT PROGRAMMED BY CNO, AND TRANSPORTED IMPRESSIVE TOTALS OF 5366 PASSENGERS, 493 THOUSAND LBS OF MAIL, AND MORE THAN 1.8 MILLION LBS OF CARGO TO FORCES AFLOAT AND ASHORE IN THE EASTERN MED. BY 01 MAR 84, HC-4 ATTAINED FULL OPERATIONAL CAPABILITY AND BEGAN SIMULTANEOUSLY OPERATING DETACHMENTS FROM ROTA, SPAIN TO BEIRUT, LEBANON. ON 14 APR 84, HC-4 WAS OPERATING DETACHMENTS AT THREE DEPLOYED SITES WHILE SIMULTANEOUSLY PROVIDING HELICOPTER LOGISTICS SUPPORT FROM HOME BASE IN SIGONELLA, SICILY.

(2) 28 APRIL MARKED SQUADRON DEPARTURE FROM LARNACA, CY, HOWEVER, 10 DAYS LATER HC-4 WAS AGAIN CALLED TO THE EASTERN MED TO RE-ESTABLISH AN "AIR BRIDGE" TO THE USS NASSAU AMPHIBIOUS READY





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GROUP, OPERATING OFF THE COAST OF BEIRUT, LEBANON. WHILE EMBARKED IN USS NASSAU THROUGH 11 AUG, THE HC-4 DETACHMENT SET IMPRESSIVE STANDARDS BY MEETING 100 PERCENT OF ASSIGNED OPERATIONAL COMMITMENTS. ON 14 AUG 84, THREE DAYS AFTER THE RETURN OF THE NASSAU DET, HC-4 WAS TASKED WITH YET ANOTHER UNIQUE DEPLOYMENT BY PROVIDING SUPPORT TO OPERATION "INTENSE LOOK". THIS DEPLOYMENT AGAIN DEMONSTRATED SQUADRON VERSATILITY AND THE RANGE OF THE AIRCRAFT CAPABILITIES, BY PROVIDING RESPONSIVE LOGISTIC SUPPORT TO THIS HIGH VISIBILITY TASK FORCE. WHILE EMBARKED IN USS SHREVEPORT FOR REDEPLOYMENT TO NAS SIGONELLA, LPD-12 WAS UNEXPECTEDLY DIVERTED TO LEBANON FOLLOWING THE 20 SEPTEMBER BOMBING OF THE AMERICAN EMBASSY BEIRUT. PROCEEDING DIRECTLY TO THE COAST OF BEIRUT, THE HC-4 DETACHMENT PROVIDED IMMEDIATE MEDEVAC AND CRITICAL SUPPORT TO AMERICAN EMBASSY PERSONNEL. BY JCS DIRECTION, HC-4 DETACHMENTS PROVIDED DIRECT SUPPORT FOR 87 OF THE 101 REMAINING DAYS OF THE CALENDAR YEAR, SERVING AS THE SOLE MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION AND LIFELINE TO THE AMERICAN EMBASSY, BEIRUT.

(3) THROUGHOUT CY 84 HC-4 DEPLOYED 29 DETACHMENTS PROVIDING CONTINUOUS SUPPORT TO SIX CVBG'S, THREE AMPHIBIOUS READY GROUPS, A SURFACE ACTION GROUP AND A HOST OF SURFACE COMBATANTS DEPLOYING IN AND OUT OF THE MEDITERRANEAN THEATER. SUCCESSFULLY INTRODUCING THE



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NAVY CH-53E AND ESTABLISHING IMPRESSIVE MEDITERRANEAN LOGISTIC RECORDS, THE FOLLOWING FACTORS ARE SIGNIFICANT:

1. IOC WAS ACHIEVED WITH 60 PERCENT ENLISTED PERSONNEL AND 66 PERCENT OFFICER COMPLIMENT.

2. TEMPORARY FACILITIES; NO AIRCRAFT HANGAR: ALL MAJOR MAINTENANCE PERFORMED ON THE FLIGHT LINE OR FLIGHT DECK.

3. OPERATED FROM REMOTE SITES, OUTSIDE NORMAL SUPPLY CHANNELS.

4. INSUFFICIENT IMPLAND ONLY ONE CSP TO SUPPORT THREE DETACHMENT OPERATIONS.

5. CONCURRENT WITH INITIAL EAST MED OPERATIONS, HC-4 FUNCTIONED AS A FLEET REPLACEMENT SQUADRON, TRAINING 33 PERCENT OF PILOTS AND 25 PERCENT OF AIRCREW NOT PROVIDED ENROUTE FRS TRAINING.

6. USING ASSIGNED CETS, TRAINED AND QUALIFIED MAINTENANCE PERSONNEL, RAISING ONBOARD TRAINING RATE FROM 56 TO 90 PERCENT OF DESIGNATED NEC BILLETS.

(4) HC-4 HAS ATTAINED AN ENVIABLE RECORD OF MISSION READINESS AND DEMONSTRATED SUPERIOR OPERATIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS. THE MEN AND WOMEN OF HC-4 ARE CLEARLY DESERVING OF THE 1984 BATTLE EFFICIENCY AWARD.



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
