COMMAND COMPOSITION AND ORGANIZATION

Helicopter Mine Countermeasures Squadron 15 (HM-15) is homeported at NAS Alameda, California, and is the first operational squadron equipped with the MH-53E "Sea Dragon"--tail code TB. HM-15 received five aircraft during 1988. The squadron is under both the operational and administrative command of Commander, Anti Submarine Warfare Wing, U.S. Pacific Fleet (COMASWWINGPAC).

The squadron's primary mission is Airborne Mine COuntermeasures, or AMCM. This mission is a vital component of the U.S. Navy's task of maintaining open sea lanes. HM-15 is charged with clearing or neutralizing any minefields world wide. The entire squadron or smaller detachments are deployable on 72 hour notice to critical locations world wide in order to allow free navigation by surface units.

The Commanding Officer of HM-15 is Commander Gary P. Tornatore, a native of Canastota, New York, and a 1971 graduate of St. Lawrence University. Upon completion of the Aviation Officer Candidate Program, he was commissioned an Ensign in February 1972, and was designated a Naval Aviator in November 1972.

Commander Tornatore's first tour of duty was with Helicopter Mine Countermeasures Squadron 12 (HM-12). He participated in Operation End Sweep, the clearing of mines from Haiphong Harbor and the Coastal waters of North Vietnam. While attached to HM-12, he also took part in minesweeping operations in the Suez Canal as well as evaluation of the H-53 Vertical Onboard Delivery (VOD) services in the Mediterranean Sea.

In January 1976, Commander Tornatore reported to Helicopter Training Squadron 8 (HT-8) where he functioned as NATOPS and Standardization

Officer as well as Model Manager for the TH-57A helicopter. After fleet refresher training, CDR Tornatore reported to Helicopter Mine Counter-measures Squadron 16 (HM-16) in Norfolk, Virginia. During his tour with the Seahawks, he served as Quality Assurance Officer during Operation Evening Light, the attempt to rescue American hostages from Iran.

In May 1980, Commander Tornatore returned to HM-12 as an instructor. During his tour he served as Administration Officer and Maintenance Officer. He also served as Officer In Charge of a minesweeping detachment to CFB Shearwater in Halifax, Nova Scotia-the first operational detachment to deploy from HM-12 since the squadron's designation as a Fleet Readiness Squadron.

From August 1983 to October 1985, Commander Tornatore was assigned to USS Iwo Jima (LPH-2) where he served as Assistant Air Officer and Safety Officer. During his tour, the USS Iwo Jima completed a Mediterranean deployment which included contingency operations off the coast of Lebanon. In April 1987, he reported to HM-15 as Executive Officer. Then, on October 13, 1988, Commander Tornatore relieved Commander John W. Tennant as Commanding Officer of HM-15.
