SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1990

NARRATIVE FORMAT

VAW-113, commanded by John B. Gregor began 1990 at our home station, NAS Miramar. Having just completed a WESTPAC/Indian Ocean deployment and a major Northern Pacific exercise, the Black Eagles were tasked with a shortened turn-around. Midway through January, the squadron participated in Independent Steaming Exercise onboard the USS INDEPENDENCE (CV-62), completing Refresher Training and Carrier Qualification exercises.

In February, the squadron was underway again, working up with the new CV-62/CVW-14 team, taking decisive steps to help the ship and air wing grow as a team. Advanced Training Assessment Exercise was conducted in March with VAW-113 scoring highest in CVW-14 in each and every tested area. After a two week respite, the high tempo turn-around continued. April and May were underway with RIMPAC '90, an extremely successful multi-national exercise. Prior to returning to San Diego for Prior to Overseas Movement (POM), the squadron stopped in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, for a two day rest.

In June, the squadron departed for the Western Pacific, and started the deployment with a rousing success in the Battle Group Exercise, where VAW-113 was the Command and Control centerpiece in every warfare area. Admiral Dorsey stated this was the best Battle Group Exercise he had seen in his three years as Commander, Third Fleet. After a quick stop in Hawaii, the INDEPENDENCE continued west on deployment. The Black Eagles provided the battle group with outstanding Airborne Early Warning prior to pulling into NAS Cubi Point, R.P. and continuing on into the Indian Ocean.

Steaming toward Diego Garcia for Weapons Week, Battle Group Delta was ordered to alter its plans and steam to the North Arabian Sea.

In early August, Battle Group Delta was the first U.S. force to respond to the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait. For three months, VAW-113 answered every call in support of Operation Desert Shield, operating throughout the Gulf of Oman and Arabian (Persian) Gulf. During Operation Desert Shield, we provided outstanding Command and Control that the USS INDEPENDENCE, Battle Group Delta and Commander, Carrier Air Wing 14 have grown to consider the finest.

After completing our tour on station in support of Operation Desert Shield, the Black Eagles began our trek home. Again, VAW-113 was able to provide the finest Airborne Early Warning to the Battle Group, as they continued to train their personnel and aircrew. Airborne Early Warning coordination was tasked and delivered as the Black Eagles made port visits to Singapore, Hong Kong and Subic Bay, R.P. The Black Eagles won the coveted CVW-14 Tailhook Award for cruise 1990 with the highest squadron landing grades.

In December, after a three week extension and three months participation in Operation Desert Shield, the Black Eagles returned to San Diego for a jubilant homecoming, after the most successful cruise in recent memory.
