VAW-123 COMMAND ORGANIZATION

Carrier Airborne Early Warning Squadron 123 (VAW-123). The SCREWTOPS fly the Grumman E-2C Group 2 Hawkeye and are assigned to Carrier Air Wing ONE (CVW-1) embarked in USS GEORGE WASHINGTON (CVN-73). While ashore, VAW-123 is based at Naval Air Station Norfolk, Virginia. The squadron's administrative chain of command is through the type wing, Carrier Airborne Early Warning Wing, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, who provides administrative support as well as maintenance and technical guidance for the E-2C Hawkeye. The squadron's primary mission is to provide Airborne Early Warning (AEW) and Command and Control services to fleet forces with prompt and sustained combat operations at sea in direct support of the Carrier Air Wing, Carrier Battlegroup, and the Navy's global maritime strategy. VAW-123 is presently commanded by Commander Edward D. Rosequist.

VAW-123 proved to be a key link in the success of the operation as the SCREWTOPS provided the vital mission of Airborne Command and Control. VAW-123 also conducted exercise FINAL COURAGE, which simulated a war at sea with surface combatants from the AMERICA Battlegroup. The SCREWTOPS enjoyed port visits in Trieste, Italy and Valletta, Malta during this month.

On the 11th VAW-123 participated in a turnover with the oncoming airwing, CVW-7 aboard the USS GEORGE WASHINGTON (CVN-73). The SCREWTOPS began the TRANSLANT home to NAS Norfolk Virginia on the 14th, and conducted the squadron fly-off on the 23rd.

MARCH

Keeping with VAW-123's tradition of being on the cutting edge of Naval Aviation, the Screwtops became the first East Coast squadron to transition to the E-2C Group 2 Hawkeye aircraft. The Group 2 aircraft provided significant upgrades in radar processing and integration of GPS, as well as more powerful engines and an upgraded cockpit instrument suite. Subsequently a majority of the squadron's time was dedicated to training in the new aircraft.
