FIGHTER SQUADRON ELEVEN COMMAND HISTORY

- l. <u>MISSION</u>: Navy fighter aircraft provide the primary capabilities for the achievement of air superiority for a Carrier Battle Group. Fighters must destroy enemy aircraft (fighters, bombers, jammers, ect) under all weather conditions, day and night, and they must contribute to battle group anti-ship missle defense by attacking airborne anti-ship cruise missles. Tasks consist of detection, identification and classification of hostile airborne threats to the fleet, and hostile interceptor aircraft threatening friendly strike of reconnaissance aircraft.
- 2. a. <u>COMMANDER</u>: 1 January through 6 January 1989 CDR Isaac E. Richardson, III. 6 January through 31 December 1989 CDR Robert L. Kimmel.
- b. EXECUTIVE OFFICER: 1 January through 6 January 1989 CDR Robert L. Kimmel. 6 January through 31 December 1989 CDR Steven R. Nichols.
