



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ATTACK SQUADRON FIFTEEN COMMAND HISTORY COVER LETTER 01 MARCH 1984



Attack Squadron FIFTEEN, homeported at Naval Air Station, Cecil Field, Florida, flies the FLIR equipped VOUGHT A-7E CORSAIR II.

Nineteen Eighty-Three proved to be an eventful year for VA-15. The first few months were spent in a relatively short turnaround preparing for the 1983 - 1984 Mediterranean Cruise. Work-ups lasted from June to September and in October the VALIONS were underway.

During the last two and one-half months of 1983, the VALIONS were involved in two different military operations on two different continents. Both operations were in support of United States Forces ashore; Operation "URGENT FURY" in Grenada, lasted from 25 October through 2 November 1983, and on 4 December 1983, the VALIONS led both CVW-6 Strikes on Syrian positions in Lebanon.

VA-15 is under the administrative Command of COMLATWING ONE and Tactical Wings Atlantic Fleet. Operationally, the squadron is under CVW-6 and USS INDEPENDENCE (CV-62).

VA-15 is currently under the Command of Commander Byron L. DUFF, who assumed Command from Commander M. B. NORDEEN on 1 November 1982 aboard the USS INDEPENDENCE (CV-62). The Squadron's Executive Officer is Commander Leslie G. KAPPEL.



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NARRATIVE HISTORY FOR 1983

The year 1983 began with the VALIONS in the middle of the post 1982 Mediterranean Cruise leave periods. This standdown continued until 17 January. The remainder of January was spent with "Back in the Saddle" Training. Highlights of the month were the CLAW ONE (Commander Light Attack Wing ONE) Corrosion Audit on 18 - 19 January as well as the beginning of the 1983 COMPEX Year with Commander KAPPEL flying an A-20-R to Pinecastle Range for an "E" on the 26th of January.

Normal turnaround training continued through February with light flight operations. Two inspections were conducted in the month of February. On 14 February the Maintenance Management Team arrived for its inspection of VA-15's Maintenance Department. One week later, the Squadron's Administrative Inspection (ADMAT) was given by CLAW-1. From 5 - 11 February, VA-15 sent two aircraft to NAS Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico to participate with the USS MAHAN in CNO Project 547.

Barely two months after its return from cruise, the VALIONS again left Cecil Field, Florida, this time to Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico. The VALION/CVW-6 Orange Air Detachment was established on 3 March and ran until 28 March. During those 25 days, VA-15 acted as Orange Air for the USS CARL VINSON (CVN-70), USS EISENHOWER (CVN-69) work-ups and ORE.

The turnaround remained fast and furious as the VALIONS returned from "Roosy Roads" and went almost immediately to Naval Air Station Fallon, Nevada on 1 April 1983. During the two week weapons detachment, the VALIONS participated in weapons delivery tactics, close air support, RESCAP, Low Level Training and Coordinated Strikes. Two major "Alpha Strikes" were led by VA-15. During the Weapons Detachment, VA-15 out-classed all competition in the CVW-6 Bombing Derby and came away as the best bombing squadron in the AIRWING. The detachment ended on the fifteenth and the remainder of April was spent at Naval Air Station Cecil Field, Florida with turnaround training in preparation for the upcoming Type Training Deployment.

The month of May and the first week in June were spent in increased tempo operations culminating in a week of intensive fleet carrier landing practice (FCLP) at Naval Air Station Cecil Field and Whitehouse.

Five months after returning from the cruise, the VALIONS were again embarked on USS INDEPENDENCE (CV-62). On 9 June, the USS INDEPENDENCE left pier 7, Naval Operations Base, Norfolk, Virginia. During its five day transit to Naval Air Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, VA-15 participated on CQ/ACLS verification for INDY.

After anchoring for a short period at GITMO, the INDY left to conduct REFTRA in the GITMO Operating area. REFTRA continued

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until the 23rd of June after which the VALIONS and CV-62 transited north to Mayport, Florida. For three days following the personnel off load in Mayport on 26 June, VALIONS remained on board to help in fleet CQ for VF-101, VAW-120 and NATC.

INDY's first port visit of the work-ups was Ft. Lauderdale, Florida from 2 - 6 July. On 7 July at 0700, VA-15/CV-62 was underway and beginning Type Training I in the Jacksonville Operating area (JAX OP AREA). TYT I continued until the 19th of July. Shortly thereafter, on the 21st, the VALIONS flew off, back to Naval Air Station, Cecil Field, Florida.

Turnaround training in preparation for TYT II, III, and ORE continued through the 15th of August. Fly aboard was on the 16th of August. The VALIONS conducted Type II training from 16 - 22 August, during INDY's transit to the Puerto Rican Operating Area.

From August 23rd through the 26th, the VALIONS had a port visit in St. Thomas, Virgin Islands, after which they immediately jumped into TYT III. Type III training, again in the Puerto Rican Operating area, lasted from 26 August - 5 September. During this period of intensive operations, the VALIONS led and participated in "STRIKES" on VIEQUES RANGE as well as perfecting all areas of combat readiness.

Following a one day standdown on 6 September, the ORE began. From the 7th to the 9th, VA-15 and CVW-6 waged "war" against Orange assets - both air and naval. As a result of the ORE, the INDY/CVW team received a grade of "High Excellent". On an individual basis, VA-15 received a grade of "Low Outstanding".

Upon returning to Norfolk on 16 September, VA-15 entered its POM period, preparing for overseas movement as well as taking much needed leave. During the POM period, on 20 September, the VALIONS were awarded the Navy Expeditionary Medal for Operations off the coast of Lebanon during the periods 20 August 1982 - 5 September 1982 and 1 October 1982 - 6 December 1982.

Leave periods continued until October 7th. With ten days left, the VALIONS began FCLP in preparation for the Mediterreanean Cruse 83 - 84.

At 0900 on October 18th, 1983, the VALIONS departed Norfolk, Virginia enroute to the Mediterranean to relieve the USS EISENHOWER (CVN-69) and assume duty off the coast off Lebanon in support of the United States Multi-National Peacekeeping Force. Two days out of port, the USS INDEPENDENCE received orders to transit to the vicinity of Grenada for contingency operations, code name "OPERATION URGENT FURY".

On 25 October, Operation "URGENT FURY" began. The VALIONS began flying Close Air Support (CAS) in support of United States Peace Keeping Forces in Grenada. For the next eight days, VA-15



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flew over one hundred and forty CAS missions, delivering 21 MK-20 ROCKEYE, 21 MK-82 LDGP and 18,700 rounds of 20 MM HEI.

Upon completion of "URGENT FURY" committment on 2 November, the VALIONS and INDY began a transit east to the Mediterranean. On 11 November the VALIONS inchopped the Mediterranean and came under operational control of CTF-60, Rear Admiral Jerry TUTTLE. From inchop until turnover with the "IKE" on 18 November, VA-15 continued light flight operations. On the 19th of November, following the turnover with "IKE", Rear Admiral TUTTLE shifted his flag to the USS INDEPENDENCE and immediately the VALIONS began planning contingency targets for operations in support of U. S. Marines at Beirut International airport. During this period (17 -19 November), four carriers, USS INDEPENDENCE (CV-62), USS JOHN F. KENNEDY (CV-67), USS EISENHOWER (CV-69) and the CLEMENCEAU were operating in the Eastern Mediterranean. After the USS EISENHOWER's departure, the remainder of the month was spent alternating flight operations with the USS KENNDEY. While not flying, VA-15 engaged in alert SUCAP and contingency operations planning.

On 4 December all the contingency planning payed off. In response to hostile fire on a USS KENNEDY "TARPS" F-14, both CVW-6 and CVW-3 launched stikes into Lebanon. The two targets hit by CVW-6 were both led by VA-15. Commander DUFF led the Strike on the Syrian "Stentor" Battlefield Surveillance Radar (YC 55504760) 3350N 3545E. Two VALION aircraft were involved in this target. Commander DUFF in AE 304 and Commander (CAG) in AE 305. These two aircraft dropped MK-20 ROCKEYE and APAM on the target, taking out the radar. On egress, 305 was hit by SA-7/SA-9. Commander DUFF in AE is ejected and AE 305 crashed north of Beirut. CAG was recovered by a fisherman and his son and was returned to the USS INDEPENDENCE that afternoon.

The second target hit by VA-15/CVW-6 was the area of the Syrian 27th Artillery Brigade (vicinity: the village of Hammana, Lebanon). This Airwing Strike was planned and led by Commander Kappel. Four VALION A-7Es participated in this STRIKE. Numerous artillery (M-46 130MM) sites and AAA (ZU-23/2, ZSU-23/4) sites were hit. Again, on egress, Commander Kappel, in AE 314 was hit by an SA-7. The surface-to-air missle hit 314 in the tailpipe section damaging the turbines and blowing off the tailcone. Commander KAPPEL brought the disabled aircraft safely back aboard INDY.

The remainder of December was spent alternating flight operations with the USS KENNEDY until 22 December. From 22 December - 26 December, VA-15 enjoyed its first port visit in Haifa, Israel. On Christmas day, the USO sponsored the "BOB HOPE CHRISTMAS SHOW". After leaving Haifa, the last 4 days of 1983 were spent in the Eastern Mediterranean Operating area, again alternating flight opertations with the USS KENNEDY.




