### JANUARY

01-04 INPORT SINGAPORE.

05-11 PROCEEDED THROUGH STRAITS OF MALLORCA BACK TO STATION IN NORTH ARABIAN SEA.

- 11-14 ON STATION NORTH ARABIAN SEA.
- 15-18 CONDUCTED EXERCISE "BEACON FLASH II" WITH OMAN.
- 19 USS INDEPENDENCE BATTLE GROUP RELIEVED BY USS CARL VINSON BATTLE GROUP. CV-62 DEPARTS STATION FOR RETURN TRANSIT.
- 20-25 TRANSITED RED SEA AND SUEZ CANAL AND INCHOPPED MEDITERRANEAN EVENING OF 25TH.

#### ATTACK SQUADRON FIFTEEN NARRATIVE HISTORY FOR CY 1985

Attack Squadron 15, homeported at Naval Air Station, Cecil Field, Florida, flies the VOUGHT A-7E CORSAIR II.

Nineteen Eighty-Five was a fast-paced year for the VALIONS of VA-15. The year began in Singapore with the squadron embarked aboard the USS INDEPENDENCE (CV-62) and as a component of CVW-6. On 5 January 1985 the ship proceeded through the Straits of Malacca, returning to station in the North Arabian Sea after the seven-day port of call in Singapore. On 15 January the squadron took part in "BEACON FLASH II". The three day exercise with Oman was followed by the arrival of the USS CARL VINSON Battle Group on 19 January. With the USS INDEPENDENCE Battle Group relieved on station, we departed the North Arabian Sea for the return transit to CONUS.

After transit of the Red Sea, and the Suez Canal on January 23rd, the ship arrived in the Mediterranean on the evening of January 25th. The following day CVW-6 aircraft were participants in dual-carrier operations in the Central Mediterranean. While operating in conjunction with the USS EISENHOWER, and as part of Exercise "NATIONAL WEEK" our aircraft flew against targets in southern France as well as Sardinia. War-atsea strikes were conducted against an Italian battle group simulating Soviet tactics. The six-day exercise ended successfully with a port visit to Palma De Mallorca, Spain where we arrived on 1 February and remained for six days.

The USS INDEPENDENCE departed Spain on 7 February to transit the Atlantic and arrived inport at Norfolk, Virginia on February 19th. CVW-6 off-loaded and the VALIONS returned to Cecil Field. Squadron standdown commenced on March 1st followed by normal turnaround activities including Orange Air detachments to Puerto Rico, and Air Combat Maneuvering Training detachments to NAS Key West, Florida during May, Orange Air detachments again to Puerto Rico in July and a weapons training detachment to NAS Fallon, Nevada in August/September.

October found the VALIONS at El Centro, California where the squadron participated in Exercise "MABCAX 85". During this exercise, designed to test the effective coordination of all elements involving a Marine ground operation, the squadron provided close air support and napalm deliveries.

The VALIONS returned from El Centro in early November and began preparations for forward deployment to the West Pacific. By December 10th the VALIONS of VA-15 were in place at Marine Corps Air Station Iwakuni, Japan, beginning a scheduled six month deployment involving operations with the Fleet Marine Forces, Pacific under command of Marine Air Group 12 and the 1st Marine Air Wing. This deployment was designed to enhance the Marine and Naval Air Forces' interoperability through the sharing of expertise and techniques used by both communities in procedural and practical applications. The year ended with the VA-15 VALIONS operating onboard MCAS Iwakuni, Japan.
