

During the period 1 January through 29 July Fighter Squadron TWO was heavily involved in predeployment preparations. During this period the major areas of emphasis were air combat maneuvering, air intercept training, missile exercises and carrier qualifications. The training program was well under way by January 1976 with a gunnery deployment to El Centro, an Air Wing deployment to Fallon and a DACM adversary program with Navy Fighter Weapons School completed in 1975.

In February carrier qualifications aboard the USS ENTERPRISE began. The Bounty Hunters had five nugget crews to qualify and acquaint with shipboard operations, a marked contrast to the previous cruise when only second tour aircrews were assigned to Fighter Squadron TWO. All aircrews qualified, new and old alike, and by March cyclic operations began.

Although carrier qualifications received major emphasis tactics did not take a back seat in Fighting TWO. Four missile firing exercises were completed during this period. ACM was scheduled daily when ashore until aircraft restrictions (while engine problems were being explored) prevented it. The squadron then turned to realistic intercept training flying high speed, low altitude, multi-plane intercepts over the desert.

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The last week in June found the F-14A administratively grounded while two accident investigations were conducted. As a result Fighter Squadron TWO craned its aircraft off the USS ENTERPRISE on 30 June 76 at NAS North Island. After two weeks, complicated and extensive inspection criteria were announced. With the help of a highly dedicated and professional maintenance department Fighting TWO's men and machines were ready for deployment to WESTPAC on time and the Bounty Hunters departed Alameda aboard USS ENTERPRISE on 30 July 1976.

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C. SPECIAL TOPICS

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SIGNIFICANT EVENTS - 1976

1. Fighter Squadron TWO was awarded the NAVAIRPAC Annual Aviation Safety Award for fiscal year 1976.

2. Fighter Squadron TWO was awarded the Meritorious Unit Commendation Award for operations Eagle Pull and Frequent Wind in April 1975.

3. Fighter Squadron TWO was awarded the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal for operation Frequent Wind 29, 30, April 1975.

4. In October the squadron set a new record for monthly flight hours for FITRON TWO with 446.9 hours flown.

5. In November 1976 the Personnel Management Department was disbanded and the squadron returned to the conventional organization with a Personnel Officer in the Administrative Department.

6. On 27 December 1976 the squadron set a new record for daily flight hours for FITRON TWO with 40.1 hours flown.
