1. Per reference (a), VFC-13's command history for CY-97 is submitted.

#### 2. Command Composition and Organization

Fighter Squadron Composite 13 is one of two professional adversary squadrons remaining in the Navy. As one of eight squadrons in Carrier Air Wing Reserve TWENTY (CVWR-20), the Naval Reserve Air Wing located at NAS Atlanta, Marietta, GA, the "Saints" of VFC-13 are charged with providing threat representative aircraft, tactics and weapons systems for fleet strike fighter pilots to oppose during Fleet Replacement Squadron (FRS) detachments, Strike Fighter Advanced Readiness Programs (SFARPS) and Air Wing detachments. Based at NAS Fallon, NV VFC-13 currently flies 22 Northrop F-5E/F "Tiger II" aircraft sporting the tail code "AF". The squadron consists of 77 total Navy personnel including 16 Regular Navy Officers, six Training and Administration of Reserves (TAR) Officers, 22 Selected Reserve (SELRES) Officers and 33 enlisted personnel. The Commanding Officer during CY-97 was CDR D. W. "Ike" Eisenhart. He will be relieved by CDR M. Q. "Beads" Whittle on 14 March 1998. F-5E/F maintenance support is provided through contract with the Boeing Company. The unique blend of Regular Navy and Reserve aircrew complement each other allowing the "Fighting Saints" to execute the most prolific flight hour program in the history of Naval Reserve tactical aviation.

#### 3. Chronology

#### 4. Narrative

During 1997 the "Saints" of Fighter Squadron Composite Thirteen (VFC-13) proved their mettle in the face of many significant challenges.

VFC-13 continued to provide the highest level of Fleet Adversary Support possible during 1997. The "Saints" completed 99% of scheduled sorties and flew 98% of their adjusted flight hour program while operating the F-5E Tiger II aircraft. During this year, the squadron conducted eight detachments while supporting a wide variety of customers, including three carrier air wings and five Strike Fighter ACM Readiness Programs (SFARP) for both east and west coast F-14 and FA-18 strike fighter squadrons. The superb performance of the command's enlisted personnel was pivotal to this year's success. The McDonnell Douglas Aerospace Company (MDASCO)/Boeing Company maintenance contractors integrated quickly with the reserve team and worked tirelessly to support over thirty aircrew and a continuous flow of demanding operations. VFC-13 successfully integrated a unique mix of Selected Reserve, TAR, Regular Navy and civilian contract personnel into a cohesive and highly effective team that stands ready to continue providing the finest training possible to fleet strike fighter aircrews.

In recognition of their outstanding achievements, the VFC-13 Saints were selected as winners of the 1997 Noel Davis ("Battle E") Trophy for mission effectiveness and the 1997 Commander, Naval Air Reserve Force Safety "S" award for the safe execution of the adversary mission.

Despite a significant reduction in F-5E/F availability due to continuing tail and wing structural problems, the Saints flew 5350 sorties and 5949.8 hours while continuing to provide the absolute finest in adversary services to the fleet. With constant emphasis on safe and highly disciplined operations, Saint aircrew continued their reputation as the finest air combat training instructors in the world. The Saints are unmatched in mission accomplishment, character, credibility and "can do" spirit.
