HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. 30 April 1 May Annual Administrative and Material Inspection. VRC-40 received an overall numerical grade of 92.08, with an adjective grade of excellent. It is noted that the Personnel Inspection and Leadership areas each received numerical grades of 98. The overall Executive Department numerical grade was 96.43, with an adjective grade of outstanding.
- 2. 3 May 7 September Detachment 18, involving 3 pilots and 5 enlisted men, deployed for 4 months aboard the USS WASP (CVS-18) in the North Atlantic.
- 3. 10 July VRC-40 Change of Command. Commander William E. WILDER relieved Commander Christopher WITHERS.
- 4. 27 July VRC-40 received a citation from COMNAVAIRLANT for meritorious achievement in aviation safety during Fiscal Year 1970.
- 5. 4 September VRC-40 was awarded the Chief of Naval Operations' Safety Award for Fiscal Year 1970.
- 6. 9 September 15 December 1970 VRC-40 provided 6 ground support personnel to a detachment of Fleet Tactical Support FIFTY, located at Danang, Republic of Vietnam.

BASIC NARRATIVE

COMMAND ORGANIZATION AND MISSION

- a. Fleet Tactical Support Squadron FORTY (VRC-40) was commissioned on 1 July 1960 and assigned the mission of providing logistical air support to the Atlantic Fleet. VRC-40 is presently home based at the Naval Air Station, Norfolk, Virginia, and is under the operational control of Commander Naval Air Force Atlantic Fleet, and administrative control of Commander Fleet Air Norfolk. Commander W. E. WILDER relieved Commander C. WITHERS on 10 July 1970 as Commanding Officer.
- b. VRC-40 has an allowance of seven aircraft, but operated an average of nine aircraft during 1970, by virtue of the fact that the squadron acts as a repository for replacement C-1A aircraft for Atlantic Fleet units. The squadron operated with 32 officers and 151 enlisted men, approximately, 29 officers were aviators and 23 enlisted men were aircrewmen, approximately.
- c. VRC-40 is the only squadron in the Atlantic Fleet that carries out the umusual task of Carrier-Onboard-Delivery (COD) operations. These operations typically consist of transporting passengers, mail, and high priority cargo to and from carriers operating at sea. Additional missions are as follows: paradrop operations are provided for Navy Sea Air Land (SEAL) Teams and Marine Special Reconnisance Forces (Pathfinders); air gunspotting services are provided infrequently for Forward Air Controller training; weapons loading excercises are conducted on a quarterly basis at Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay and Naval Station, Roosevelt Roads. Also the squadron maintains a capability of paradropping urgently needed items weighing less than 50 pounds to ships at sea using the Air Deployment Delivery System (ADDS).
- d. Many of our country's leading businessmen, government officials and military leaders as well as foreign dignitaries have flown with VRC-40. Some of the noteworthy personnel transported in 1970 were: General H. Howe, USA; U.S. Senators Baker, Cook, Shebe and E. Kennedy; Under Secretary of the Navy Warner; Deputy Assistant Secretary of African Affairs R. C. Moore; and Vice Admirals R. L. Townsend, G. E. Miller and F. C. Wilkinson.

OPERATIONS

a. VRC-40 differs from the majority of aviation commands in that it rarely deploys as an entire unit. The squadron supports fleet operations with GOD detachments of one or two planes. During 1970, VRC-40 aircraft

deployed 48 times in assistance of operation along the Atlantic coast, Carribbean area, South America, and Northern Europe. The majority of these were COD detachments in support of Atlantic Fleet carriers. In performing this primary mission, VRC-40 operated out of ports along the Eastern Seaboard and in the Carribbean area for one to two week periods.

- b. The longest detachment of the year involved 3 pilots and 5 enlisted men who were deployed for four months aboard the USS WASP (CVS-18) in the North Atlantic/European Area. VRC-40 support to VRC-50, detachment Da Nang, consisted of 6 ground support personnel to Vietnam for a 3 month period.
- c. Since its commissioning in 1960, VRC-40 has transported 76,768 passengers and 70,499,336 pounds of cargo and mail, while logging 62, 614 hours of flight time and more than 12,700 arrested carrier landings. During the past calendar year VRC-40 accumulated 5,345 flight hours, 300 catapult launches and 1,169 arrested carrier landings.
- d. In 1970, VRC-kO designated & COD Transport Third Pilots, 5 COD Transport Second Pilots, and 11 COD Transport Aircraft Commanders.
- e. Despite the fact that many of the C-1A's are almost 14 years old, the Maintenance Department maintained an 83% availability throughout the year. This enabled the Operations Department to conduct a comprehensive flight training program for new pilots and aircremen during a period of gradual increased transport mission. The average flight time per aircraft per month was 52.4 hours.
