## USS ALBANY (SSN 753)COMMAND HISTORY FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1993

### 1. COMMAND COMPOSITION AND ORGANIZATION:

#### a. Mission:

- (1) USS ALBANY (SSN-753), the 43rd ship of the Los Angeles class is the Navy's newest nuclear powered attack submarine. It is the most advanced undersea vessel of its type in the world. ALBANY's mission is to seek out and destroy enemy surface ship's and submarines, and to protect our own Naval interests.
- (2) The 360 ft, 6900 ton ship is well equipped to accomplish its assigned mission. Faster than her predecessors, she is equipped with "State of the Art" highly accurate sensors and weapons control systems, and is armed with sophisticated MK 48 Anti-Submarine Torpedoes, HARPOON, and twelve vertical launch tubes in the bow to launch TOMAHAWK Cruise Missiles. ALBANY carries a crew of 134, 20 officers, and 114 enlisted men, all technical experts in their respective fields.

#### 3. Narrative.

USS ALBANY (SSN-753) successfully completed a emergent drydocking at Newport News Shipyard. She then performed all exercises with great achievement. The battery was upgraded during a major change out in the spring. ALBANY was then designated for Pre-Overseas Movement for a North Atlantic deployment in the fall. She prepared herself by completing the new Pre-Overseas Movement cycle of twenty four weeks. The crews performance at SUBSCOL New London during a training period was noted as being in the top third of the fleet. During this time, she completed a second emergent drydocking. ALBANY had the distinct honor of being the impressive backdrop for the SUBLANT Change of Command on 13 August 1993. ALBANY completed the Pre-Overseas Movement training and certification in November. The ship and crew were well prepared for the deployment. ALBANY departed on 30 November 1993 for her second major deployment and is assured to be as successful as the first. In short, the

ALBANY is a viable and capable ship with a highly trained and talented crew, able to perform its mission in any ocean in the world when called upon.
