3. <u>Narrative</u>

During January and February 1989, USS ALBUQUERQUE was deployed to the North Atlantic for ASW operations. This was followed by local training operations out of Groton, CT during April and May. In July, ALBUQUERQUE conducted Midshipmen Training Operations (TRAMID) at the Atlantic Underwater Test and Evaluation Center (AUTEC) in the Bahamas, and was host to Secretary of Defense Richard Cheney. CDR J. T. Byrd was relieved as Commanding Officer by CDR J. C. Kane in August. October saw the ship in port in Fort Lauderdale, Florida in support of Navy Appreciation Week. The months of November and December were used for a work-up for the upcoming Mediterranean deployment, with the ship underway for two weeks in November and one week in December.
