#### 4. Narrative

The year 2000 opened for ALBUQUERQUE conducting local operations in preparation for PCO operations. The spring was spent in port performing emergent nuclear repair work. On 26 April, the ship got underway for a round of PCO operations. Upon completion of PCO ops, and a brief spell of liberty in Puerto Rico, ALBUQUERQUE and her crew completed a Tactical Readiness Evaluation and Torpedo Weapons Proficiency. Returning to port at the end of May, ALBUQUERQUE spent June performing upkeep and giving the crew time off with their families.

In July ALBUQUERQUE conducted a midshipmen cruise and pre-deployment certification. She took to sea on 23 August enroute to Curacao, N.A. in the Caribbean for a port call prior to operations in the South Atlantic. ALBUQUERQUE and her crew performed successfully during operations with Joint Interagency Task Force East from 31 August - 28 September. ALBUQUERQUE then completed an Operational Reactor Safeguard Examination during 3-6 October before arriving in Port Everglades, Florida for a well needed and deserved port visit from 6-10 October. There, she participated in functions and festivities associated with Broward County Navy Days. Prior to departing the area, ALBUQUERQUE hosted a VIP group from her namesake city. Leaving Port Everglades on 10 October, ALBUQUERQUE facilitated a Tiger Cruise for family members of her crew while heading for homeport. She arrived in Groton on 13 October.

In a rushed upkeep from 14-22 October, ALBUQUERQUE again readied herself for sea and departed Groton on October 23 to Naval Station Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico to conduct another round of rigorous PCO operations and TRE support for one of her fellow submarines on the AUTEC range near Bermuda. Upon her return home on 18 November, she and her crew took a short breath before beginning a robust upkeep on 27 November which lasted until the holiday shutdown of 22 December - 8 January 2001.
