1. The following command history of USS ALEXANDRIA (SSN 757) is submitted in accordance with reference (a). The period covered is from January 1996 through December 1996.

4. Narrative. Upon completion of a deployment to the Western Atlantic in January, ALEXANDRIA received the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon and Arctic Service Ribbon. Several upkeep periods were accomplished in 1996, including a Pre-Overseas Movement (POM) upkeep preparing for an emergent deployment to the Western Atlantic. Those receiving the post-deployment debrief of the summer deployment by the Commanding Officer were: Deputy Director, National Security Agency; Director and Deputy Director, Office of Naval Intelligence; Chief of Naval Operations (N21 and N87); Deputy, CINCLANTFLT; and COMSUBLANT.

ALEXANDRIA received the following awards from Submarine Development Squadron TWELVE for the period 1996: The Tactical "T" for tactical warfare excellence, the Navigation "N" for excellence in Navigation, and the Engineering "E" for engineering excellence.
