4. Narrative.

Nineteen nintey-eight has been an incredible year for BENFOLD. The ship successfully and safely returned from serving in the Arabian Gulf and the crew was met with warm welcome home. The rest of the year offered time to start preparing for the next deployment while implementing innovative approaches to ship maintenance, management and retention. As a result, BENFOLD was fortunate to receive a number of awards for excellence including the Battle Efficiency Award and the prized Spokane Trophy for "Most combat ready ship in the Pacific Fleet." Enclosure (1) highlights the achievements of BENFOLD's crew in the past year and serves as our narrative.

5. Biography of current commanding officer - Commander D. Michael Abrashoff

Commander Donald Michael Abrashoff was born in the USS ALBERT DAVID (FFG 1050) where United States Naval Academy. His initial sea duty assignment was in the USS ALBERT DAVID (FFG 1050) where he served as Communications Officer and Anti-Submarine Warfare Officer. Upon completion of Department Head School, he was ordered to USS HARRY W. HILL (DD 986) where he served as Combat Systems Officer. His second tour was as Combat Systems Officer in USS ENGLAND (CG 22). During this tour, he participated in Operation DESERT SHIELD in Southwest Asia. He served as Executive Officer in USS SHILOH (CG 67) which also deployed to Southwest Asia.

Commander Abrashoff served ashore as Aide and Flag Lieutenant to Commander, Naval Surface Group Western Pacific/Commander Surface Combatant Force Seventh Fleet and Commander Logistics Support Force Seventh Fleet in Subic Bay, RP. In Washington, D.C., he served as a Surface Warfare Assignment Officer, Junior Officer Shore Coordinator and Cruiser Destroyer Atlantic Fleet Placement Officer. Additionally, he served as the Military Assistant to the Secretary of Defense, the Honorable William J. Perry.

Commander Abrashoff's personal awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal, four Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medals, and one Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, various Campaign and Service Medals and four Battle "E" Awards for shipboard excellence.
