3. <u>Biography of current commanding officer - Commander Thomas H Copeman III.</u>

Commander Copeman graduated from Creighton University in May 1981 with a BS in Biology. He was commissioned on April 2, 1982 from Officer Candidate School, Newport, RI. Following Basic SWOS he reported to USS LEFTWICH (DD 984) and served 30 months as Electrical Officer and Main Propulsion Assistant. CDR Copeman then served 24 months as a gas turbine examiner for the CINCPACFLT Propulsion Examining Board. After graduating from SWOS Department Head course he was assigned as commissioning Engineer Officer in USS PHILIPPINE SEA (CG 58) where he served for 44 months. His most recent sea duty was Executive Officer in USS LAKE CHAMPLAIN (CG 57). He assumed command of BENFOLD on January 21, 1999.

CDR copeman's shore assignments were as a student at United States Army Command and General Staff Course at Fort Leavenworth Kansas followed by a tour as an action officer in the Special Technical Operations cell at USSTRATCOM, Offutt AFB, NE. He received a MS in Administration from Central Michigan University while in Leavenworth. Following his XO tour he was assigned to the Chief of Naval Operations staff as a requirements officer in the Theater Air Warfare branch (N865) of the Surface Warfare Division (N86).
