BASIC COMMAND HISTORY

USS BREMERTON has continued it's journey towards operational readiness and Western Pacific deployment.

The overhaul was completed in March 1992. In April 1992, the ship completed it's first ORSE since June 1988, recieving high marks for Level of Knowledge and Material Readiness.

The crew was thrust into Weapons Readiness Certifications. The Weapons department with help from NAV/OPS department completed the tasks ahead of scheduled agenda. The ship was tasked with an Eastern Pacific deployment to conduct sound trials at David Taylor Naval Research Center. While on deployment, the crew enjoyed port visits to Canada, Washington state and Alaska.

Upon return to Pearl Harbor, the ship docked in PHNSY to conduct a resin discharge. In August, the ship recognized the crew for their acheivments by having an awards ceremony at Subase Memorial Park. Also in August, the ship said goodbye to CDR Hughes and welcomed CDR Crochet in a change of command ceremony on the 14th.

The ship completed resin discharge in October, and prepared to participate in ASWOP, with ships representing Canada and the United States.

The ship returned to San Diego to replace an imploded Sonar Dome in November. Upon replacement of imploded Sonar Dome, the ship returned to Pearl Harbor to celebrate the holidays.

The BREMERTON continued it's fine sports tradition this year by winning the Subase Afloat League Softball Championship and the Subase "Captain's Cup" for the second year in a row. The ship also had high standings in Soccer and the Annual Squadron Seven "Commodore's Cup".

The BREMERTON supported the Navy's CFC by donating over \$5,000, the ship also donated to both Pearl Harbor's and San Diego's Christmas Relief organizations.
