3. Narrative. In January 1999, USS BUFFALO (SSN 715) was awarded the Coast Guard Special Operations Ribbon for her exceptional performance as part of a special joint operation with the United States Coast and Canadian naval forces in This award is rarely presented to a submarine November 1998. and special authorization was required from the Chief of Naval Operations. USS BUFFALO's 1999 at-sea operations commenced with an Operational Reactor Safequards Examination and preparations for a Western Pacific Deployment. The pre-overseas movement (POM) process was completed with a successful Tactical Readiness Examination/POM certification. On 30 April 1999, Buffalo transited to the Seventh Fleet AOR and commenced a six-month Western Pacific deployment by participating in SHINKAME, a subon-sub exercise with the Japanese Submarine JDS FUYOSHIO. Following a brief stop in Yokosuka, Buffalo conducted an exercise with the Japanese DSRV unit.

BUFFALO then conducted special operations in the Seventh Fleet AOR and upon completion, proceeded to Chinhae, Korea for a submarine exercise. The ship then transited to Yokosuka, Japan and conducted a three-week upkeep.

With repairs complete, BUFFALO headed for the Sea of Japan for coordinated operations with the USS Constellation Battle Group. The ship was able to integrate smoothly into the operations of the battle group, demonstrating the diversity and flexibility of a modern SSN.

Following Battle Group Operations, Buffalo enjoyed a liberty port call in Pattaya Beach, Thailand and then conducted special operations in the Seventh Fleet AOR.

On 27 August 1999, Buffalo arrived in Okinawa to prepare for the tactical development exercise SHAREM-130. The Surface Warfare Development Group conducted the exercise and included U.S./Japanese surface, sub and air assets. SHAREM was followed by several weeks of special operations in the Seventh Fleet AOR.

After the special operations, Buffalo proceeded to Guam for a brief voyage repair and then transited to Brisbane, Australia for a liberty port call. Subsequently, the ship headed for Pearl Harbor and concluded the deployment with a successful ORSE.

The return to Pearl Harbor was followed by a well-earned one-month standown for the crew during the month of November.

BUFFALO closed out 1999 with an upkeep period leading into the Christmas holidays, which were spent with families and friends.

Nineteen ninety-nine was a year filled with operational commitments. The ship and crew performed superbly throughout the year and earned several awards recognizing her strong performance. BUFFALO was nominated for the Arleigh Burke Fleet Trophy by Commander Submarine Squadron One as the most improved ship in the fleet and was awarded the 1999 Battle Efficiency "E" and Engineering Red "E" for operational and engineering excellence.
