

Mission/Command Employment/Area of Operations: Crew swap from USS ROBIN (MHC 54) to USS SHRIKE (MHC 62), Engineering Operation Certification, crew swap to USS CARDINAL (MHC 60), deployment to Fifth Fleet (Arabian Gulf), Nautical Union 2006, FAWOMO Exercise 2006, crew swap to the USS SHRIKE (MHC 62).

- h. Task Force/Group/Unit Name(s) and mission(s): Mine Hunter's are manned by rotational crews. Therefore, a crew's task force/group/unit name, along with their mission, will vary depending on where they are deployed. Over the course of the last year, MHC CREW GALLANT was involved with a Fifth Fleet Deployment to the Arabian Gulf where they participated in

Nautical Union 2006. Nautical Union is a joint exercise where the United States' forward deployed mine countermeasures assets work with the Royal Saudi Navy, simulating potential situations that could arise in the future. Also while deployed, MHC CREW GALLANT participated in "Find a Way or Make One," exercise (FAWOMOEX). FAWOMOEX was a mine countermeasure exercises utilizing both air and surface based assets. This exercise simulated the most significant threat to the Arabian Gulf, the mining of the Straits of Hormuz. During this time, MHC CREW GALLANT embarked on USS CARDINAL (MHC 60) was attached to Mine Countermeasures Division Three One, the Immediate Superior in Command of the forward deployed mine countermeasures assets.

While home ported in Naval Station Ingleside, MHC CREW GALLANT is embarked on the USS SHRIKE (MHC 62). While attached to the USS SHRIKE (MHC 62), Mine Countermeasures Squadron Two is our Immediate Superior in Command.

2. Commander's Assessment: Coastal Minehunter ships are strategic assets designed with a primary mission of Minehunting to clear harbor, coastal, and ocean waters of acoustic, magnetic, pressure and contact mines. A suspected minefield will be entered and searched using precise navigation systems and a variable depth sonar. Suspected mines will be investigated with a remote controlled submarine, which can also neutralize mines using explosives and other techniques. Since Coastal Minehunter hulls are made of a special fiberglass and resin, they are easy to maintain and flex to absorb the violent shock of any underwater mine explosion. For added safety, Coastal minehunter ships are designed to have very low magnetic and acoustic signatures.

In 2006, MHC CREW GALLANT was embarked onboard USS ROBIN (MHC 54), USS SHRIKE (MHC 62), and USS CARDINAL (MHC 60). Using ROBIN and SHRIKE as training platforms in Ingleside, Texas, the crew deployed fully combat ready onboard CARDINAL in the Arabian Gulf and participated in numerous multi-national, multi-ship exercises. MHC CREW GALLANT successfully employed all of CARDINAL's minewarfare capabilities in support of Commander Fifth Fleet objectives in Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF), Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and the Global War on Terrorism (GWOT). CARDINAL's exhaustive efforts earned her the reputation as Fifth Fleets workhorse for all minewarfare and deterrence operations.
